1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subsections 3 and 5 of section 53-12.1-01,

2 subsection 1 of section 53-12.1-04, sections 53-12.1-08 and 53-12.1-09, subsection 1 of

3 section 53-12.1-11, subsection 1 of section 53-12.1-12, and subsection 2 of section 57-40.3-04

4 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the North Dakota lottery and a motor vehicle

5 excise tax exemption for a motor vehicle to be awarded as a prize by the lottery; to provide a

6 penalty; and to declare an emergency.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

8	SEC	CTION 1. AMENDMENT. Subsections 3 and 5 of section 53-12.1-01 of the North
9	Dakota Cer	tury Code are amended and reenacted as follows:
10	3.	"Online lottery" means a game linked to a central computer via a
11		telecommunications network in which the player selects or is assigned a specified
12		number or symbol or group of numbers or symbols out of a predetermined range of
13		numbers or symbols and a winning ticket is determined by chance.
14	5.	"Ticket" means an original and acceptable tangible evidence of play prescribed by
15		the lottery and produced by a lottery terminal or a properly and validly registered
16		subscription play to prove participation in a draw of a game for a chance to win a
17		prize.
18	SEC	CTION 2. AMENDMENT. Subsection 1 of section 53-12.1-04 of the North Dakota
19	Century Co	de is amended and reenacted as follows:
20	1.	There is created the lottery advisory commission, which is composed of five
21		members, three of whom are legislators selected by the chairman of the legislative
22		council and two of whom are selected by the attorney general. The term of office
23		is three years, expiring on June thirtieth with no more than two terms expiring in
24		any one year. Of the first members appointed, one must be appointed for a term

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1		of one year, two must be appointed for terms of two years, and two must be				
2		appointed for terms of three years. No member may be appointed to more than				
3	two consecutive terms. Each member must be a citizen of the United States and a					
4	resident of this state. A chairman of the commission must be chosen annually					
5	from the membership of the commission by a majority of its members at the first					
6	meeting of the commission each fiscal year. A member may serve as chairman for					
7	more than one year.					
8	SEC	CTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 53-12.1-08 of the North Dakota Century Code is				
9	amended a	nd reenacted as follows:				
10	53-	12.1-08. Purchase of ticket or payment of prize to certain persons prohibited -				
11	Price of a t	ticket - Sale by retailer only - Retailer second <u>Second</u> chance drawing				
12	drawings -	Prize paid to owner of a winning ticket - Prize subject to taxation - Discharge				
13	of liability	- Penalty.				
14	1.	A North Dakota lottery ticket may not be bought by or otherwise provided to, and a				
15		prize may not be paid to, the following individuals or to a parent, stepparent, child,				
16		stepchild, spouse, or sibling who is a regular member of the same household of				
17		the following individuals:				
18		a. A member of the lottery advisory commission or employee of the lottery,				
19		unless authorized in writing by the director; or				
20		b. An officer or employee of the lottery's gaming system vendor.				
21		A person who knowingly violates this subsection is guilty of a class B				
22		misdemeanor on the first offense and a class A misdemeanor on a subsequent				
23		offense.				
24	2.	A retailer or employee of a retailer may buy a ticket and be paid a prize for a				
25		winning ticket.				
26	3.	Only a retailer may sell a ticket. A retailer may sell a ticket only at the site stated				
27		on the license or at a temporary site for a special event authorized by the lottery.				
28		A retailer may not sell a ticket at a price greater than the price set by the lottery				
29		rules. A person convicted of violating this subsection is guilty of a class A				
30		misdemeanor on the first offense and a class C felony on a subsequent offense.				

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1	4.	A retailer may conduct a second chance drawing of entry forms or nonwinning	
2		tickets to promote the sale of a ticket at that site provided that a person is not	
3		required to purchase a ticket to participate.	
4	5.	No ticket may be sold or given to a minor. A retailer, employee of a retailer, or any	
5		other person who knowingly violates this subsection is guilty of a class B	
6		misdemeanor on the first offense and a class A misdemeanor on a subsequent	
7		offense.	
8	6.	The prize to be paid or awarded for a winning ticket must be paid to the person	
9		who the director determines is the owner of the ticket. However, the prize of a	
10		deceased winning player must be paid to the lawful representative of the estate.	
11		No prize may be paid on a winning ticket that has been purchased by use of a	
12		stolen lottery gift certificate or acquired illegally.	
13	7.	If an individual steals a ticket or lottery gift certificate from a retailer, the individual	
14		is guilty of a class A misdemeanor. However, if the total value of the tickets or gift	
15		certificates stolen exceeds five hundred dollars, the offense is a class C felony.	
16	8.	A prize awarded is subject to state and federal income tax laws and rules.	
17	9.	A person who, with intent to defraud, falsely makes, alters, forges, passes, or	
18		counterfeits a ticket or gift certificate issued by the lottery, regardless of the	
19		amount gained, is guilty of a class C felony.	
20	10.	The state, members of the lottery advisory commission, and employees of the	
21		lottery are discharged of all further liability upon payment of a prize.	
22	SEC	CTION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 53-12.1-09 of the North Dakota Century Code is	
23	amended a	nd reenacted as follows:	
24	53-1	2.1-09. Operating fund - Continuing appropriation - Authorization of	
25	disbursem	ents - Report - Net proceeds. There is established within the state treasury the	
26	lottery operation	ating fund into which must be deposited all revenue from the sale of tickets, interest	
27	received on money in the fund, and all other fees and moneys collected, less a prize on a		
28	lottery promotion, prize on a winning ticket or lottery promotion paid by a retailer, and the a		
29	retailer's commission. Except for moneys in the lottery operating fund appropriated by the		
30	legislative assembly for administrative and operating costs of the lottery under section		
31	53-12.1-10, all other money in the fund is continuously appropriated for the purposes specified		

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1	in this section	on. D	During each regular session, the attorney general shall present a report to the			
2	appropriations committee of each house of the legislative assembly on the actual and					
3	estimated o	estimated operating revenue and expenditures for the current biennium and projected				
4	operating re	evenu	e and expenditures for the subsequent biennium authorized by this section. A			
5	payment of	a priz	ze or expense or transfer of net proceeds by the lottery may be made only			
6	against the	fund	or money collected from a retailer on the sale of a ticket. A disbursement from			
7	the fund mu	the fund must be for the following purposes:				
8	1.	Payment of a prize as the director deems appropriate to the owner of a valid,				
9		winr	ning ticket;			
10	2.	Notv	vithstanding section 53-12.1-10, payment of a marketing expense that is			
11		<u>dire</u>	ctly offset by cosponsorship funds collected;			
12	<u>3.</u>	Payı	ment of a gaming system or related service expense, retailer record and credit			
13		<u>che</u>	ck fees, game group dues, and retailer commissions; and			
14	3. <u>4.</u>	Trar	nsfer of net proceeds:			
15		a.	Starting July 1, 2005, fifty Fifty thousand dollars must be transferred to the			
16			state treasurer each quarter for deposit in the compulsive gambling			
17			prevention and treatment fund;			
18		b.	An amount for the lottery's share of a game's prize reserve pool must be			
19			transferred to the multistate lottery association; and			
20		C.	The balance of the net proceeds, less holdback of any reserve funds the			
21			director may need for continuing operations, must be transferred to the state			
22			treasurer on at least an annual basis for deposit in the state general fund.			
23	SEC		5. AMENDMENT. Subsection 1 of section 53-12.1-11 of the North Dakota			
24	Century Co	de is	amended and reenacted as follows:			
25	1.	The	following information and records of the lottery are confidential:			
26		a.	Sales and income tax information, financial statements, and a credit report of			
27			a retailer applicant or person seeking or doing business with the lottery, and			
28			retailer application information other than the applicant's name and location;			
29		b.	Information related to a person owing a debt to the state or having a debt			
30			collected through a state agency that is made confidential by another state			
31			law or rule;			

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1		C.	Internal control and security procedures, security information on a winning
2			ticket, and information on a bid or contractual data, the disclosure of which is
3			harmful to the efforts of the lottery to contract for goods and services on
4			favorable terms;
5		d.	Personal information on a winning player who purchases a subscription or a
6			player who wins a prize on a winning ticket unless the player authorizes, in
7			writing, release of the information; and
8		e.	Lottery sales data, the disclosure of which is harmful to the competitive
9			position of the lottery, retailer, or person seeking or doing business with the
10			lottery. However, a retailer may authorize the lottery to release the retailer's
11			lottery sales data.
12	SEC		6. AMENDMENT. Subsection 1 of section 53-12.1-12 of the North Dakota
13	Century Co	de is	amended and reenacted as follows:
14	1.	A cla	aimant agency and the director shall cooperate on the setoff of a winning
15		lotte	ry ticket or promotional cash prize against a delinquent debt. A claimant
16		ager	ncy is an agency of the state of North Dakota that a person owes money to or
17		that	collects money on behalf of another party to satisfy a debt. The claimant
18		ager	ncy and director shall share necessary information, including the person's full
19		nam	e, social security number, and amount and type of debt, through a mutually
20		con	venient method to timely achieve a setoff of a prize.
21	SEC		7. AMENDMENT. Subsection 2 of section 57-40.3-04 of the North Dakota
22	Century Co	de is	amended and reenacted as follows:
23	2.	Any	motor vehicle owned by or in possession of the federal or state government or
24		a po	litical subdivision thereof or a motor vehicle procured by or on behalf of the
25		<u>Nort</u>	h Dakota lottery that is to be awarded as a prize in a game or promotion.
26	SEC		8. EMERGENCY. This Act is declared to be an emergency measure.
