- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subsections 1 and 2 of section 16.1-11-06, section
- 2 16.1-11-10, subsection 1 of section 16.1-11-11, subdivision a of subsection 2 of section
- 3 16.1-11-11, subdivision a of subsection 1 of section 16.1-11-16, subsection 1 of section
- 4 16.1-11-21, subsection 2 of section 16.1-11-26, and section 16.1-11-32 of the North Dakota
- 5 Century Code, relating to primary elections; and to repeal section 16.1-11-07 of the North

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 8 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Subsections 1 and 2 of section 16.1-11-06 of the North 9 Dakota Century Code are amended and reenacted as follows:
 - A certificate of endorsement signed by the state chairman of any legally recognized political party containing the candidate's name, post-office address, and telephone number, the title of the office to which the candidate aspires, and the party which the candidate represents; or
 - 2. A petition containing the following:
 - a. The candidate's name, post-office address, and telephone number, and the title of the office to which the candidate aspires, the appropriate district judgeship number if applicable, and whether the petition is intended for nomination for an unexpired term of office <u>if applicable</u>.
 - b. The name of the party the candidate represents if the petition is for an office under party designation.
 - c. The signatures of qualified electors, the number of which must be determined as follows:
 - (1) If the office is under party designation, the signatures of three percent of the total vote cast for the candidates of the party with which the

29	be considered in determining which form of voting i	s used. Candidates from each
