FIRST ENGROSSMENT

ENGROSSED SENATE BILL NO. 2254

1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 36-01 of the North Dakota

2 Century Code, relating to hunting on big game and farmed elk facilities; to amend and reenact

3 sections 36-25-05 and 36-25-08 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to escape and

4 identification of farmed elk; and to provide a penalty.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

6 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 36-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is 7 created and enacted as follows:

Big game and farmed elk facilities - Fee shooting prohibited - Penalty. After the
effective date of this Act, the shooting of big game, as defined in section 20.1-01-02, or farmed
elk for a fee or other remuneration on a licensed big game or farmed elk facility is prohibited. A
person who willfully violates this section is guilty of a class B misdemeanor.

SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 36-25-05 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 amended and reenacted as follows:

14 36-25-05. Confinement - Rules - Escape. Farmed elk must be confined in a manner 15 designed to prevent escape. Unless otherwise required by rule, fencing for farmed elk must be 16 at least eighty four ninety-six inches [213.36 243.84 centimeters] in height. If any farmed elk 17 escape, their owner shall report the escape to the board within one business day of the 18 discovery and shall notify the board upon recapture. The owner shall cause any farmed elk to 19 be recaptured or destroyed within four days of the escape. The owner is liable for the expenses 20 incurred by another person in capturing, caring for, and returning farmed elk that have escaped, 21 provided the other person notifies the owner as soon as practicable after discovering the 22 escape.

23 SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 36-25-08 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 24 amended and reenacted as follows:

- 1 **36-25-08. Identification.** The owner of farmed elk shall identify each animal by a
- 2 means of identification approved by the board an ear tag visible at one hundred yards [91.44
- 3 <u>meters] in low-light conditions</u>.
