1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact two new sections to chapter 15.1-21 of the North Dakota

2 Century Code, relating to the education of English language learners; and to amend and

3 reenact section 15.1-27-12 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to per student payments

4 for English language learners.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

6 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 15.1-21 of the North Dakota Century Code is 7 created and enacted as follows:

8	De	finitio	ns. In this chapter, unless the context otherwise requires:			
9	<u>1.</u>	<u>"En</u>	"English immersion" means an English language acquisition process in which:			
10		<u>a.</u>	A student, to the greatest extent possible, is taught in English;			
11		<u>b.</u>	The curriculum is designed for an English language learner; and			
12		<u>C.</u>	All textbooks and instructional materials are in English.			
13	<u>2.</u>	<u>"En</u>	glish language learner" means a student who:			
14		<u>a.</u>	Has a primary language other than English or comes from an environment in			
15			which a language other than English significantly impacts the student's level			
16			of English language proficiency; and			
17		<u>b.</u>	Has difficulty speaking, reading, writing, and understanding English as			
18			evidenced by a language proficiency test approved by the superintendent of			
19			public instruction and aligned to the state English language proficiency			
20			standards.

3	<u>2.</u>	<u>lf a</u>	student, through testing, is determined to be an English language learner, the		
4		<u>stuc</u>	dent must be taught by means of English immersion.		
5	<u>3.</u>	<u>A s</u>	chool district may place in the same classroom students who are of different		
6		<u>age</u>	es but who have similar levels of English proficiency.		
7	<u>4.</u>	When a student, through testing, can demonstrate that the student is able to d			
8		reg	ular schoolwork in the English language, the student must be transferred to a		
9		reg	ular classroom. Each student must be tested at least once during the fall and		
10		onc	e during the spring of each year. The parent of any student taught by means of		
11		Eng	glish immersion may request an additional test during each school year.		
12	<u>5.</u>	<u>Thi</u>	s section does not apply to:		
13		<u>a.</u>	The teaching of foreign language classes to students who are not English		
14			language learners; or		
15		b.	The provision of special education and related services.

12		individual's level of English language proficiency; and		
13		d. Must have difficulty speaking, reading, writing, and understanding English, as		
14		evidenced by a language proficiency test approved by the superintendent of		
15		public instruction and aligned to the state English language proficiency		
16		standards be an English language learner, as defined in section 1 of this Act.		
17	3.	In order to be eligible for the payment provided for in this section, a school district		
18		must provide an approved program of instruction English immersion, as defined in		
19		section 1 of this Act, for students who have preliterate English language skills,		
20		beginning English language skills, intermediate English language skills, or basic		
21		English language skills.		
22	4.	a. In order to receive the full payment provided for in this section, a school		
23		district must assess each eligible student using a proficiency test that is		
24		aligned to the state English language proficiency standards and the state		
25		language proficiency test.		
26		b. On or before December first of each year, a school district shall submit to the		
27		superintendent of public instruction an application for payment. The		
28		application must include:		
29		(1) A description of the district's English language learner immersion		
30		program;		

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1			(2)	The result of the district's annual student assessment required under	
2				subdivision a; and	
3			(3)	Any other information requested by the superintendent of public	
4				instruction.	
5	5.	a.	Each	year of the biennium the superintendent of public instruction shall	
6			calcu	late the total weighted number of students eligible for payment during	
7			that y	rear by determining the sum of all English language learner students	
8			weigł	nted as follows:	
9			(1)	Ten times the number of level I students;	
10			(2)	Eight times the number of level II students;	
11			(3)	Four times the number of level III students; and	
12			(4)	The number of level IV students.	
13		b.	The s	superintendent of public instruction shall determine the per student	
14			amou	int used to calculate payments under this section during the first year of	
15			the b	iennium by dividing the total weighted number of students eligible for	
16			paym	ent under this section into forty-nine percent of the total amount	
17			appro	opriated for this section.	
18		C.	The s	superintendent of public instruction shall determine the per student dollar	
19			amou	int used to calculate payments under this section during the second year	
20			of the	e biennium by dividing the total weighted number of students eligible for	
21			paym	ent under this section into fifty-one percent of the total amount	
22			appro	opriated for this section.	
23	6.	The	super	intendent shall distribute the payments no later than May thirtieth of each	
24		school year.
