- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 15.1-21-01 and 15.1-21-02 of the North
- 2 Dakota Century Code, relating to a requirement for North Dakota studies.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-21-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 15.1-21-01. Education of students Requirements. The superintendent of public
 instruction shall ensure that students receive education in:
- English language arts, including reading, composition, creative writing, English
 grammar, and spelling.
- 10 2. Mathematics.
- Social studies, including the United States Constitution, and United States history,
 geography, and government.
- 4. Science, including agriculture.
- 5. North Dakota studies, including North Dakota history, geography, and agriculture.
- 15 6. Physical education.
- 6. 7. Health, including physiology, hygiene, disease control, and the nature and effects
 of alcohol, tobacco, and narcotics.
- SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-21-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 20 15.1-21-02. High schools Required units.
- 21 1. In order to be approved by the superintendent of public instruction, each public and nonpublic high school shall make available to each student:
- a. Four units of English language arts;
- b. Four units of mathematics;

2			d.	Four units of social studies, including one of world history and one of United
3				States history;
4			e.	One-half unit of health;
5			f.	One-half unit of physical education;
6			g.	Two units of fine arts, at least one of which must be music;
7			h.	Two units of the same foreign language; and
8			i.	Two units of career and technical education.
9		2.	In a	ddition to the requirements of subsection 1, each public and nonpublic high
10			scho	ool shall make available to each student, at least once every two years, one
11			<u>unit</u>	of North Dakota studies, with an emphasis on the geography, history, and
12			<u>agri</u>	culture of this state.
13		<u>3.</u>	Eac	h unit which must be made available under subsection 1 this section must
14			mee	et or exceed the state content standards.
15	3.	<u>4.</u>	For	purposes of this section, unless the context otherwise requires, "make
16			avai	ilable" means that:
17			a.	Each public high school and nonpublic high school shall allow students to
18				select units over the course of a high school career from a list that includes at
19				least all the units provided in subsection 1 those required by this section;
20			b.	If a student selects a unit from the list required by subsection 1 this section,
21				the public high school or the nonpublic high school shall provide the unit to the
22				student; and
23			C.	The unit may be provided to the student through any delivery method not
24				contrary to state law and may include classroom or individual instruction and
25				distance learning options, including interactive video, computer instruction,
26				correspondence courses, and postsecondary enrollment under chapter
27				15.1-25.
28	4.	<u>5.</u>	The	board of a school district may not impose any fees or charges upon a student
29			for t	he provision of or participation in units as provided in this section, other than
30			the 1	fees permitted by section 15.1-09-36.

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1 If in order to meet the minimum requirements of this section a school district 2 includes academic courses offered by a postsecondary institution under chapter 3 15.1-25, the school district shall: 4 Pay all costs of the student's attendance, except those fees that are a. 5 permissible under section 15.1-09-36; and 6 Transport the student to and from the location at which the course is offered b. 7 or provide mileage reimbursement to the student if transportation is provided 8 by the student or the student's family. 9 6. 7. The requirements of this section do not apply to alternative high schools or 10 alternative high school education programs.
