- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 12-47 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to health care for chronically or terminally ill offenders.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 12-47 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:
 - Definitions Health care for chronically or terminally ill offenders Notice to health care facility.
- 8 1. As used in this section:
 - a. "Chronically ill" has the same meaning as in section 26.1-33.2-01.
 - b. "Department" means the department of corrections and rehabilitation.
 - c. "Health care facility" means an assisted living facility as defined in section 23-09-01, a basic care facility as defined in section 23-09.3-01, or a nursing home as defined in section 23-30-01, except that transitional care units and other long-term care beds owned or operated on the premises of acute care hospitals or critical care hospitals are not health care facilities for the purpose of this section.
 - <u>d.</u> "Terminally ill" has the same meaning as in section 26.1-33.2-01.
- 18 2. If an offender is to be given an early release, pardon, or parole due to a chronic or
 19 terminal illness for admission as a resident of a health care facility due to the
 20 chronic or terminal illness, the department shall provide prior written notice to the
 21 administrator of the facility, stating:
 - a. The offense for which the offender was convicted and a description of the actual offense:
 - b. The offender's status with the department;

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1	<u>C.</u>	That, subject to subsection 3, the information provided by the department
2		regarding the offender may be provided to residents and employees of the
3		facility by the administrator of the facility;
4	<u>d.</u>	The offender's health status and type of health care the offender requires;
5	<u>e.</u>	Any available risk assessment information regarding the offender's likelihood
6		of reoffending; and
7	<u>f.</u>	The name of the party responsible for the payment for the services provided
8		by the health care facility to the offender.
