1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 12.1-22-03 of the North Dakota Century Code,

2 relating to criminal trespass.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 12.1-22-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 amended and reenacted as follows:

12.1-22-03. Criminal trespass.

- A person <u>An individual</u> is guilty of a class C felony if, knowing that <u>he that</u>
 <u>individual</u> is not licensed or privileged to do so, <u>he the individual</u> enters or remains
 in a dwelling or in highly secured premises.
- A person <u>An individual</u> is guilty of a class A misdemeanor if, knowing that he that
 individual is not licensed or privileged to do so, he the individual:
- a. Enters or remains in <u>or on</u> any building, occupied structure, or storage
 structure, or separately secured or occupied portion thereof; or
- b. Enters or remains in any place so enclosed as manifestly to exclude intruders.

A person An individual is guilty of a class B misdemeanor if, knowing that that 16 person individual is not licensed or privileged to do so, that person the individual 17 enters or remains in any place as to which notice against trespass is given by 18 actual communication to the actor by the person individual in charge of the 19 premises or other authorized person individual or by posting in a manner 20 reasonably likely to come to the attention of intruders. The name of the person 21 posting the premises must appear on each sign in legible characters. A person An 22 individual who violates this subsection is guilty of a class A misdemeanor for the 23 second or subsequent offense within a two-year period.

1	4.	A person An individual is guilty of a class B misdemeanor if that person individual
2		remains upon the property of another after being requested to leave the property
3		by a duly authorized person <u>individual</u> . A person <u>An individual</u> who violates this
4		subsection is guilty of a class A misdemeanor for the second or subsequent
5		offense within a two-year period.
6	5.	This section does not apply to a peace officer in the course of discharging the
7		peace officer's official duties.
