PROPOSED AMENDMENT OF SENATE RULE 501(1)

SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Subsection 1 of Senate Rule 501 is amended as follows:

1. The Committee on Committees consists of nine eight members. The Majority Leader, by virtue of office, is a member of the committee and shall serve as the chairman. The Majority Leader shall appoint five four other members from the majority party and three members from the minority party to the committee. The committee shall appoint standing committees concerned with matters in the fields as indicated and procedural committees.
