SCR 4005: A concurrent resolution directing the Legislative Council to study the feasibility and desirability of establishing a transition to independence program for young adults with mental illness.

Was read the first time and referred to the Human Services Committee.

The Senate stood adjourned pursuant to Senator Christmann's motion.
