## Transition-aged youth at risk program - Definition - Rules.

8 The department shall develop and implement or contract for the implementation of 1. 9 a program for services to transition-aged youth at risk. The department shall use 10 a wraparound planning process. The department shall adopt rules to establish 11 eligibility, services, and a distinct statewide interagency advisory council on 12 transition-aged youth at risk, with youth and family representation, and with 13 regional subcommittees. For the purposes of this section, transition-aged youth 14 means children and young adults at risk due to: 15 Foster care, deprivation, or activity in the juvenile justice system; a. 16 b. Serious mental illness or serious disabilities that do not qualify the youth for 17 developmental disabilities case management; or 18 Suicidal tendencies. C. 19 Within the limits of appropriations, services under the program must include: 2. 20 Individualized assessments to determine the needs and appropriate services a. 21 to individual transition-aged youth at risk; 22 <u>b.</u> Single plan of care to coordinate services among available service systems, 23 emphasizing existing case management resources; 24 Independent living skills, including self-advocacy training; C. | 9  | 9 SECTION 2. TRANSITION-AGED YOUTH AT RISK PILOT PROJECT. During the                              |            |  |
| 10 | 2009-11 biennium, the department of human services shall develop and implement on a pilot         |            |  |
| 11 | basis a program that provides those services listed in subsection 2 of section 1 of this Act. The |            |  |
| 12 | pilot program must be conducted at an accessible location in an urban community with a large      |            |  |
| 13 | population of transition-aged youth at risk and must be open for various relevant community       |            |  |

| 15 | SECTION 3. APPROPRIATION. There is appropriated out of any moneys in the                          |            |  |
| 16 | general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$700,000, or so much  |            |  |
| 17 | of the sum as may be necessary, to the department of human services for the purpose of            |            |  |
| 18 | establishing and implementing a pilot program for transition-aged youth at risk as provided in    |            |  |
| 19 | section 2 of this Act, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, and ending June 30, 2011.         |            |  |
