Sixtieth Legislative Assembly

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Bismarck, March 5, 2007

The Senate convened at 1:00 p.m., with President Dalrymple presiding.

The prayer was offered by Pastor Rich Wyatt, Living Hope Church of the Nazarene, Bismarck.

The roll was called and all members were present except Senators Cook, Mathern, and Olafson.

A quorum was declared by the President.

FIRST READING OF HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

HCR 3030: A concurrent resolution congratulating Ms. Ashley Andrews on becoming Miss Rodeo America 2007.
Was read the first time.

MOTION

SEN. CHRISTMANN MOVED that the rules be suspended, that HCR 3030 not be printed, not be referred to committee, but be read in its entirety, be printed in the Journal, and be placed on the calendar for immediate second reading and final passage, which motion prevailed.

WHEREAS, having won the national title, Ashley Andrews became the first resident of North Dakota to do so in 24 years; and

WHEREAS, during this coming year, Ashley Andrews will travel over 100,000 miles, appear at over 100 rodeos, and represent the Professional Rodeo Cowboys Association as Miss Rodeo America 2007; and

WHEREAS, Ashley Andrews is a beautiful, talented, and intelligent young woman, a cancer survivor, and a credit to her North Dakota roots;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF NORTH DAKOTA, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:

That the Sixtieth Legislative Assembly extends its heartiest congratulations to Ms. Ashley Andrews and wishes her much joy and happiness as she undertakes her new role as Miss Rodeo America 2007; and

ADDRESS OF MISS RODEO AMERICA, ASHLEY ANDREWS

When you think of California, what do you think of? Clear sandy beaches with hot "Bay Watch" babes running around, saving lives in an endless deep, blue ocean? Or how about Wisconsin, providing you with enough cheese to leave you in the bathroom for hours? But how about North Dakota? Did you draw a blank, or did you shiver with cold? Which leaves me with one word, snow.

North Dakota isn't for the faint of heart; its sometimes 50 below winters make its citizens as tough as nails. Some even grow to enjoy shoveling snow, scraping car windows, and occasionally getting snowed in. But you must admit, without snow, we'd be without so many things. Like snowmobiles, snowshoes, snow skies, snowmen, snow angels, and snow bunnies. We would even be without a North Dakotan's favorite piece of advice, "Never eat yellow snow".

Maybe it's because of the snow and cold weather that North Dakota is sparsely populated and made up of many small towns which make it normal to see your best friend driving a tractor down main street, or to make your idea of going out to lunch driving to the auction barn on sale day. And there is no doubt that North Dakota's harsh weather played a part in creating some of the toughest rodeo cowboys of our time, like world champion bareback rider Wayne Herman, or world champion saddle bronc riders Brad Gjermundson and Alvin Nelson. They say that North Dakota can grow tough bareback and saddle bronc riders because no one wants to get bucked off here and have to walk home in this weather!

Now don't let the cold scare you, there is much more to North Dakota than cold and snow, because North Dakotans are some of the most kind, outgoing, hardworking, and honest people you will ever meet. I guess I'll let you in on a little secret. We actually use the cold weather and snow as a scare tactic, because if everyone knew just how great North Dakota really was they would all want to pack up and move here tomorrow.

So to you, North Dakota might just mean snow; but to me, North Dakota is the place where the grass grows lush, green and stirrup high, and the water runs cool, clear and deep. And I know when I make my last inevitable ride, when my last judge tells me my entry fees have been paid; I'll be in my new home, just like my home here in North Dakota.
