SCR 4007: A concurrent resolution urging Congress to provide adequate funding for state meat and poultry inspection programs and to enact legislation that allows federally approved state programs to ship state-inspected products interstate.

REMARKS OF ANNETTE OLSON, MISS. NORTH DAKOTA 2007

When I am visiting with youth, we often discuss their goals and future ambitions. This is my favorite part of being Miss North Dakota. These young people have bright futures and big dreams. I am convinced that we have some of the country's best educated, most talented, and hard working kids. Thank you for the work you do to support education in our small schools as well as our larger schools. You have deemed youth leadership and achievement programs in our state, programs like 4-H, a priority. These programs give our children the skills to achieve their dreams.

The ongoing work to bring new businesses and opportunities in technology, research, and renewable energy offers promising futures for the youth of North Dakota. This is an exciting time of growth and economic development in our state. With all of the potential on the horizon, North Dakota is a great place for young people.
