1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact chapter 23-39 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating

2 to regulation of tanning facilities; and to provide a penalty.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

4 SECTION 1. Chapter 23-39 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted 5 as follows: 6 **23-39-01. Definitions.** As used in this chapter, unless the context otherwise requires: 7 1. "Department" means the state department of health. 8 "Phototherapy device" means equipment that emits ultraviolet radiation and is 2. 9 used in treating disease. 10 "Tanning device" means equipment that emits electromagnetic radiation having 3. 11 wavelengths in the air between two hundred and four hundred nanometers and 12 which is used for tanning of human skin and any equipment used with that 13 equipment, including food and drug administration-approved protective eyewear, 14 timers, and handrails. The term does not include a phototherapy device used by a 15 physician. 16 4. "Tanning facility" means a place or business that provides individuals access to a 17 tanning device. 18 23-39-02. Permit - Fee. A person may not operate a tanning facility without a permit 19 issued by the department under this chapter. The holder of a permit shall display the permit in 20 a conspicuous place at the tanning facility for which the permit is issued. Permits issued under 21 this chapter expired annually on June thirtieth. An applicant for a permit shall submit an 22 application for a permit to the department, on a form provided by the department, with a permit 23 fee established by the department. The application must include the name and complete

4		<u>1.</u>	<u>A ta</u>	anning facility may not state in any advertising that the tanning facility holds a
5			lice	nse or permit issued by the department to operate a tanning facility.
6		<u>2.</u>	<u>A ta</u>	anning facility shall give to each of the tanning facility's customers written notice
7			<u>of t</u> l	ne following:
8			<u>a.</u>	Failure to wear the eye protection provided by the tanning facility may result
9				in damage to the customer's eyes and may cause cataracts;
10			<u>b.</u>	Overexposure to a tanning device causes burns;
11			<u>C.</u>	Repeated exposure to a tanning device may cause premature aging of the
12				skin and may cause skin cancer;
13			<u>d.</u>	Abnormal skin sensitivity or burning of the skin while using a tanning device
14				may be caused by:
15				(1) <u>Certain foods;</u>
16				(2) Certain cosmetics; and
17				(3) Certain medications, including tranquilizers, diuretics, antibiotics, high
18				blood pressure medicines, and birth control pills; and
19			<u>e.</u>	An individual who takes a drug should consult a physician before using a
20				tanning device.
21		<u>3.</u>	<u>A ta</u>	anning facility shall display prominently a warning sign in each area where a
22			<u>tanı</u>	ning device is used. The warning sign must convey the following directions and
23			info	rmation:
24			<u>a.</u>	Follow instructions.
25			<u>b.</u>	Avoid too frequent or too lengthy exposure. Like exposure to the sun, use of
26				a tanning device can cause eye and skin injury and allergic reactions.
27				Repeated exposure can cause chronic sun damage, which is characterized
28				by wrinkling, dryness, fragility and bruising of the skin, and skin cancer.
29			<u>C.</u>	Wear food and drug administration-approved protective eyewear.

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1		<u>d.</u>	Ultraviolet radiation from tanning devices will aggravate the effects of the sun,		
2			so do not sunbathe during the twenty-four hours immediately preceding or		
3			immediately following the use of a tanning device.		
4		<u>e.</u>	Medications and cosmetics may increase your sensitivity to ultraviolet		
5			radiation. Consult a physician before using a tanning device if you are using		
6			medications, have a history of skin problems, or believe that you are		
7			especially sensitive to sunlight. Women who are pregnant or using birth		
8			control pills and who use a tanning device may develop discolored skin.		
9		<u>f.</u>	If your skin does not tan when exposed to the sun, it is unlikely that your skin		
10			will tan when exposed to this tanning device.		
11	<u>4.</u>	The	e tanning facility shall maintain a record of the date on which each fluorescent		
12		<u>tub</u>	e is replaced.		
13	<u>5.</u>	<u>An</u>	owner or employee of a tanning facility may not claim, or distribute materials		
14		<u>tha</u>	t claim, that using a tanning device is free of risk.		
15	<u>23-</u>	39-04	4. Liability. A tanning facility's compliance with this chapter does not relieve		
16	the owner	or an	y employee of the tanning facility from liability for injury sustained by a user of a		
17	7 tanning device.				
18	8 <u>23-39-05. Duties.</u>				
19	<u>1.</u>	The	e owner of a tanning facility shall ensure that all of the following are fulfilled:		
20		<u>a.</u>	A customer under eighteen years of age may not be permitted to use the		
21			tanning facility until the customer provides the facility with written consent, in		
22			a form prescribed by the department, of a parent or legal guardian to use the		
23			tanning facility. The consent must indicate that the parent or legal guardian		
24			has read the warnings required by this chapter and that the customer agrees		
25			to wear food and drug administration-approved protective eyewear. The		
26			parent or legal guardian shall provide a notarized statement of consent or		
27			sign the consent form in the presence of the owner of the tanning facility or an		
28			employee responsible for the operation of the ultraviolet radiation device of		
29			the facility. The written consent form expires twelve months from the date		
30			signed. A customer under the age of fourteen years may not be allowed to		
31			utilize a tanning device at a tanning facility without a written order from a		

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1			physician licensed in this state and without being accompanied by a parent or
2			legal guardian for every use of the tanning facility.
3		<u>b.</u>	During operating hours there is present at the tanning facility a trained
4		<u>0.</u>	operator who is able to inform customers about, and assist customers in, the
5		_	proper use of tanning devices.
6		<u>C.</u>	Each tanning bed is properly sanitized after each use.
7		<u>d.</u>	Properly sanitized and securely fitting food and drug administration-approved
8			protective eyewear that protects the wearer's eyes from ultraviolet radiation
9			and allows enough vision to maintain balance is made available to the
10			customer.
11		<u>e.</u>	A customer is not allowed to use a tanning device unless the customer
12			agrees to use food and drug administration-approved protective eyewear.
13		<u>f.</u>	A customer is shown how to use such physical aids as handrails and
14			markings on the floor to determine the proper distance from the tanning
15			device.
16		<u>g.</u>	A timing device that is accurate within ten percent is used.
17		<u>h.</u>	Each tanning device is equipped with a mechanism that allows the customer
18			to turn off the tanning device.
19		<u>i.</u>	A customer is limited to the maximum exposure time recommended by the
20			manufacturer.
21		j.	A customer is not allowed to use a tanning device more than once every
22			twenty-four hours.
23		<u>k.</u>	The interior temperature of the tanning facility does not exceed one hundred
24			degrees Fahrenheit.
25		<u>I.</u>	The statements under subdivision a of subsection 2 are retained by the
26			tanning facility for the lesser of three years or until the customer signs a new
27			statement.
28	<u>2.</u>	<u>A us</u>	ser of a tanning facility shall do all of the following:
29		<u>a.</u>	Immediately before the customer's first use of a tanning facility in a year, sign
30			a statement acknowledging that the customer has read and understands the
31			notice under subsection 2 of section 23-39-03 and the warning sign under

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1		subsection 3 of section 23-39-03 and specifying that the customer agrees to
2		use food and drug administration-approved protective eyewear.
3	<u>b.</u>	Use food and drug administration-approved protective eyewear at all times
4		while using a tanning device.
5	<u>23-39-06</u>	. Injury reports. If an individual requires medical attention due to use of a
6	tanning facility, a	ny physician, medical professional, or the owner of that tanning facility shall
7	report that injury	to the department in writing and send a copy of that report to the injured
8	individual. The c	wner of the tanning facility shall retain a copy of the report for at least three
9	<u>years.</u>	
10	<u>23-39-07</u>	. Enforcement - Rules - Penalty. The department shall enforce this chapter.
11	The state health	council shall adopt rules necessary to implement this chapter. The
12	department may	deny issuance of a permit to an applicant or suspend or revoke any permit
13	issued under this	chapter if the applicant or permitholder, or an employee of the applicant or
14	permitholder, vio	lates this chapter or any rule adopted to implement this chapter. Violation of
15	this chapter or a	ny rule adopted to implement this chapter is a class B misdemeanor.
