- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 23-09.3-04 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 2 relating to state department of health surveys of basic care facilities; and to provide for a report
- 3 to the legislative council.

## 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 5 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 23-09.3-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is 6 amended and reenacted as follows:
- 7 23-09.3-04. Department to establish standards Licensing Inspection Survey -
- 8 Prosecute violations. It is the duty of the The department to shall establish standards for
- 9 basic care facilities. The department shall inspect all places and grant annual licenses to basic
- 10 care facilities as conform to the standards established and comply with the rules prescribed, as
- 11 provided in this chapter. The department shall implement a survey process for basic care
- 12 facilities which for purposes of the life safety portions of the survey, all surveys must be
- announced; which for purposes of the health portions of the survey, half of the surveys must be
- 14 announced; and which for purposes of complaints related to health and life safety, all surveys
- 15 must be unannounced. As part of the survey process, the department shall develop, in
- 16 consultation with basic care facilities, and shall implement a two-tiered system of identifying
- 17 areas of noncompliance with the health portions of the survey. The department shall prosecute
- 18 all violations of this chapter.

## 19 SECTION 2. STATE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH - REPORT TO LEGISLATIVE

- 20 **COUNCIL.** Before August 1, 2008, the state department of health shall provide a report to the
- 21 legislative council regarding the impact of implementation of this Act, including whether the
- 22 department will be recommending any legislative changes to the basic care survey process.
