- 1 A concurrent resolution to create and enact a new section to article V of the Constitution of
- 2 North Dakota, relating to executive branch organization.

## 3 STATEMENT OF INTENT

- 4 This measure would provide that the legislative assembly must allocate the executive power
- 5 among not more than twenty-five principal state departments.

- That the following proposed new section to article V of the Constitution of North Dakota is agreed to and must be submitted to the qualified electors of North Dakota at the general
- 10 election to be held in 2008, in accordance with section 16 of article IV of the Constitution of
- 11 North Dakota.

- SECTION 1. A new section to article V of the Constitution of North Dakota is created and enacted as follows:
- The legislative assembly shall allocate the executive power among not more than
- twenty-five principal state departments, which must be organized along broad functional lines.
- 16 The executive power of each department must be vested in one individual unless otherwise
- 17 provided by this constitution or by law. The legislative assembly shall prescribe the duties of
- 18 the executive departments and periodically shall reorganize the departments, except any
- 19 reorganization or change in duties may not affect the organization and powers granted to the
- 20 state board of higher education under this constitution.
- 21 For more effective administration, the governor may make changes in the statutory
- 22 allocation of functions, powers, and duties among and within the executive departments, other
- than those headed by constitutionally elective officials. Any change must be set forth in an
- 24 executive order and submitted to both houses of the legislative assembly on the same day. If
- 25 not disapproved by a majority of the members elected to either house of the legislative

- 1 <u>assembly within thirty days after submission by the governor, the order becomes effective when</u>
- 2 filed with the secretary of state or on a later date specified in the order.
