- 8 for positions related to technical aspects of the energy sector; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Bismarck State College is well-positioned to provide broad educational
- 10 opportunities not only to individuals involved in the state's energy sector, but to individuals
- 11 involved in many challenging 21st century fields;
