- 1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the state industrial
- 2 commission and the agencies under the management of the industrial commission; to authorize
- 3 transfers; to provide an exemption; to amend and reenact section 6-09.17-02 of the North
- 4 Dakota Century Code, relating to the biodiesel partnership in assisting community expansion
- 5 fund; and to declare an emergency.

APPROPRIATION.** In addition to the amount appropriated to the housing 4 finance agency in subdivision 5 of section 3 of this Act, there is appropriated any additional 5 income or unanticipated income from federal or other funds which may become available to the 6 agency for the biennium beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2009. 7 SECTION 5. APPROPRIATION - EMERGENCY COMMISSION APPROVAL. In 8 addition to the amount appropriated to the state industrial commission in subdivision 1 of 9 section 3 of this Act, there is appropriated, with the approval of the emergency commission, 10 funds that may become available to the commission from bonds authorized by law to be issued 11 by the state industrial commission under chapters 4-36 and 54-17.2 and section 54-17-25, for 12 the biennium beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2009. 13 **SECTION 6. EXEMPTION.** The amount appropriated to the Bank of North Dakota in 14 the capital assets line item in sections 3 and 6 of 2005 Senate Bill No. 2014 is not subject to the 15 provisions of section 54-44.1-11. Any unexpended funds from this appropriation are available 16 for construction of a new building during the biennium beginning July 1, 2007, and ending 17 June 30, 2009. 18 **SECTION 7. TRANSFER.** The sum of \$80,195, or so much of the sum as may be 19 necessary, included in the special funds appropriation line item in subdivision 1 of section 3 of 20 this Act, is from the North Dakota mill and elevator association. The moneys must be 21 transferred during the biennium beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2009, upon order 22 of the state industrial commission. 23 **SECTION 8. TRANSFER.** The sum of \$102,066, or so much of the sum as may be 24 necessary, included in the special funds appropriation line item in subdivision 1 of section 3 of 25 this Act, is from the accumulated and undivided profits of the Bank of North Dakota. The 26 moneys must be transferred during the biennium beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 27 2009, upon order of the state industrial commission. 28 **SECTION 9. TRANSFER.** The sum of \$69,259, or so much of the sum as may be 29 necessary, included in the special funds appropriation line item in subdivision 1 of section 3 of 30 this Act, is from the housing finance agency fund. The moneys must be transferred during the

biennium beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2009, upon order of the state industrialcommission.

**SECTION 10. TRANSFER.** The sum of \$21,872, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, included in the special funds appropriation line item in subdivision 1 of section 3 of this Act, is from the revenues of the public finance authority. The available moneys must be transferred during the biennium beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2009, upon order of the state industrial commission.

SECTION 11. INCOME AUTHORIZATION - STUDENT LOAN TRUST. There is authorized the receipt of fees by the state industrial commission in the sum of \$91,131, or so much of the sum as is owed, included in the special funds appropriation line item in subdivision 1 of section 3 of this Act, from the student loan trust for administrative services rendered by the state industrial commission to the extent permitted by sections 54-17-24 and 54-17-25. The fees must be received during the biennium beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2009, upon order of the state industrial commission.

**SECTION 12. TRANSFER.** The state industrial commission shall transfer to the general fund in the state treasury the sum of \$5,000,000 from the North Dakota mill and elevator association. The moneys must be transferred in amounts and at such times as requested by the director of the office of management and budget during the biennium beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2009.

SECTION 13. LIGNITE RESEARCH, DEVELOPMENT, AND MARKETING PROGRAM - APPROPRIATION - LIGNITE MARKETING FEASIBILITY STUDY. The amount of \$1,500,000, or so much of the amount as may be necessary, included in the grants and special funds appropriation line item in subdivision 1 of section 3 of this Act, is appropriated from the lignite research fund for the purpose of contracting for an independent, nonmatching lignite marketing feasibility study or studies that determine those focused priority areas where near-term, market-driven projects, activities, or processes will generate matching private industry investment and have the most potential of preserving existing lignite production and industry jobs or that will lead to increased development of lignite and its products and create new lignite industry jobs and economic growth for the general welfare of this state. Moneys appropriated pursuant to this section may also be used for the purpose of contracting for nonmatching studies and activities in support of the lignite vision 21 project; for nonmatching

- 1 externality studies and activities in externality proceedings; or other marketing, environmental,
- 2 or transmission activities that assist with marketing of lignite-based electricity and lignite-based
- 3 byproducts. Moneys not needed for the purposes stated in this section are available to the
- 4 commission for funding projects, processes, or activities under the lignite research,
- 5 development, and marketing program.

## 6 SECTION 14. LEGISLATIVE INTENT - BOND PAYMENTS. The amount of

**SECTION 15. APPROPRIATION - TRANSFER.** The funds appropriated in subdivision 3 of section 3 of this Act must be transferred by the Bank of North Dakota to the partnership in assisting community expansion fund; the agriculture partnership in assisting community expansion fund; and the biofuels partnership in assisting community expansion

- fund. The Bank of North Dakota may not be construed to be a general fund agency because of the appropriation made by subdivision 3 of section 3 of this Act.
- 3 **SECTION 16. TRANSFER AUTHORITY.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, 4 the Bank of North Dakota may transfer any unobligated funds between funds that have been
- 5 appropriated by the legislative assembly for partnership in assisting community expansion fund
- 6 and the biofuels partnership in assisting community expansion fund.
  - **SECTION 17. AMENDMENT.** Section 6-09.17-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 9 6-09.17-02. Biodiesel partnership in assisting community expansion fund -
- 10 Continuing appropriation Administration. A biodiesel partnership in assisting community
- 11 expansion fund is hereby established. All moneys transferred into the fund, interest on fund
- moneys, and payments to the fund are hereby appropriated for the purposes of this chapter.
- 13 This fund is <u>not</u> subject to section 54-44.1-11 and any unexpended and unobligated balance in
- 14 the fund at the end of the biennium must be transferred to the state general fund biofuels
- 15 partnership in assisting community expansion fund. The Bank of North Dakota shall administer
- 16 the fund.

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- 17 **SECTION 18. EMERGENCY.** The appropriation in subdivision 3 of section 3 of this Act
- 18 for the partnership in assisting community expansion fund; the transfer in section 15 of this Act
- 19 for the partnership in assisting community expansion fund; and the transfer in section 16 of this
- 20 Act between the partnership in assisting community expansion fund and the biofuels
- 21 partnership in assisting community expansion fund are declared to be emergency measures.
