**SENATE BILL NO. 2062**

1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 43-30 of the North Dakota  
2 Century Code, relating to criminal history background checks for proprietary security officers.

3 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:**

4 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 43-30 of the North Dakota Century Code is  
5 created and enacted as follows:

6 **Proprietary security.** A person may employ individuals to provide security for that  
7 person's own property or protection. A proprietary employer is not required to be licensed as a  
8 private security service if the employer does not offer or provide security services to others.

9 1. All proprietary security employees and any employee who directly supervises  
10 proprietary security employees, who are hired after July 31, 2007, must undergo a  
11 state and national criminal history background check by the bureau of criminal  
12 investigation and the federal bureau of investigation. The employer must obtain a  
13 copy of the results of the state and national criminal history background check and  
14 file a copy with the board within ninety days after the start of employment.

15 2. Proprietary security employees may also be voluntarily registered as security  
16 officers under section 43-30-06. In order to be registered as a proprietary security  
17 officer, an employee must meet all of the requirements to be registered as a  
18 security officer except for:

19 a. Employment by a licensed private security service; and

20 b. Supervision by an individual who is licensed to provide security services.
