- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 43-30 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to criminal history background checks for proprietary security officers.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 43-30 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:
 - Proprietary security. A person may employ individuals to provide security for that person's own property or protection. A proprietary employer is not required to be licensed as a private security service if the employer does not offer or provide security services to others.
 - 1. All proprietary security employees and any employee who directly supervises proprietary security employees, who are hired after July 31, 2007, must undergo a state and national criminal history background check by the bureau of criminal investigation and the federal bureau of investigation. The employer must obtain a copy of the results of the state and national criminal history background check and file a copy with the board within ninety days after the start of employment.
 - 2. Proprietary security employees may also be voluntarily registered as security officers under section 43-30-06. In order to be registered as a proprietary security officer, an employee must meet all of the requirements to be registered as a security officer except for:
 - a. Employment by a licensed private security service; and
- 20 b. Supervision by an individual who is licensed to provide security services.
