- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 37-28-03 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 2 relating to the payment of military adjustment compensation.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 4 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 37-28-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 6 37-28-03. Payment of adjusted compensation for domestic and foreign service.
- 7 Each national guard or reserve component resident veteran mobilized stateside is entitled to
- 8 fifty dollars for each month or major fraction thereof for domestic service, not to exceed nine
- 9 hundred dollars. Each active component veteran who is a resident of North Dakota, and who
- 10 was a resident of North Dakota at the time of initial enlistment into the armed forces, is entitled
- 11 to fifty dollars for each month or major fraction of a month for stateside service since
- 12 September 11, 2001, not to exceed nine hundred dollars. Each national guard, reserve, or
- 13 active component resident veteran of foreign service who received the expeditionary medal or
- 14 campaign badge is entitled to one hundred dollars for each month or major fraction thereof, not
- 15 to exceed one thousand eight hundred dollars. Combined totals for stateside and foreign
- 16 service may not exceed one thousand eight hundred dollars. If the veteran received a purple
- 17 heart for foreign service, the veteran is entitled to a payment of two thousand five hundred
- 18 dollars in lieu of monthly payments for adjusted compensation. If the veteran is deceased, the
- 19 veteran's beneficiary is entitled to any payments under this chapter to which the veteran would
- 20 have been entitled. Applications for adjusted compensation may be filed with the adjutant
- 21 general through June 30, 2007 2009, or in the case of a soldier mobilized on June 30, 2007
- 22 <u>2009</u>, not later than six months after the end of the mobilization period of service.
