1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 37-28-03 of the North Dakota Century Code,
2 relating to the payment of military adjustment compensation.

3 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:**

4 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 37-28-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is
5 amended and reenacted as follows:

6 **37-28-03. Payment of adjusted compensation for domestic and foreign service.**

7 Each national guard or reserve component resident veteran mobilized stateside is entitled to
8 fifty dollars for each month or major fraction thereof for domestic service, not to exceed nine
9 hundred dollars. Each active component veteran who is a resident of North Dakota, and who
10 was a resident of North Dakota at the time of initial enlistment into the armed forces, is entitled
11 to fifty dollars for each month or major fraction of a month for stateside service since
12 September 11, 2001, not to exceed nine hundred dollars. Each national guard, reserve, or
13 active component resident veteran of foreign service who received the expeditionary medal or
14 campaign badge is entitled to one hundred dollars for each month or major fraction thereof, not
15 to exceed one thousand eight hundred dollars. Combined totals for stateside and foreign
16 service may not exceed one thousand eight hundred dollars. If the veteran received a purple
17 heart for foreign service, the veteran is entitled to a payment of two thousand five hundred
18 dollars in lieu of monthly payments for adjusted compensation. If the veteran is deceased, the
19 veteran's beneficiary is entitled to any payments under this chapter to which the veteran would
20 have been entitled. Applications for adjusted compensation may be filed with the adjutant
21 general through June 30, ~~2007~~ 2009, or in the case of a soldier mobilized on June 30, ~~2007~~
22 2009, not later than six months after the end of the mobilization period of service.
