1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 54-52-02.9 and 54-52-27, subsection 1 of

2 section 54-52.1-03.2, and subsection 2 of section 54-52.1-03.3 of the North Dakota Century

3 Code, relating to contributions and benefits under the retiree health benefits fund of the public

4 employees retirement system.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

6 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 54-52-02.9 of the North Dakota Century Code is
7 amended and reenacted as follows:

8 54-52-02.9. Participation by temporary employees. A temporary employee may 9 elect, within one hundred eighty days of beginning employment, to participate in the public 10 employees retirement system and receive credit for service after enrollment. The temporary 11 employee shall pay monthly to the fund an amount equal to eight and twelve-hundredths 12 percent times the temporary employee's present monthly salary. The temporary employee 13 shall also pay the required monthly contribution to the retiree health benefit fund established 14 under section 54-52.1-03.2 one percent times the temporary employee's present monthly 15 salary. This contribution must be recorded as a member contribution pursuant to section 16 54-52.1-03.2. An employer may not pay the temporary employee's contributions. A temporary 17 employee may continue to participate as a temporary employee in the public employees 18 retirement system until termination of employment or reclassification of the temporary 19 employee as a permanent employee. A temporary employee may not purchase additional 20 credit under section 54-52-17.4.

SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 54-52-27 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 amended and reenacted as follows:

23 54-52-27. Purchase of sick leave credit. At termination of eligible employment a
24 member is entitled to credit in the retirement system for each month of unused sick leave, as

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1 certified by the member's employer, if the member or the member's employer pays an amount 2 equal to the member's final average salary, times the number of months of sick leave 3 converted, times the percent of employer and employee contributions to the retirement program 4 of the member, plus one percent the required contribution for the retiree health benefits 5 program. Hours of sick leave equal to a fraction of a month are deemed to be a full month for 6 purposes of conversion to service credit. A member may convert all of the member's certified 7 sick leave or a part of the member's certified sick leave. All conversion payments must be 8 made within sixty days of termination of employment and before the member receives a 9 retirement annuity unless the member has submitted an approved payment plan to the board. 10 SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Subsection 1 of section 54-52.1-03.2 of the North Dakota

11 Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

12 1. The board shall establish a retiree health benefits fund account with the Bank of 13 North Dakota for the purpose of prefunding and providing hospital benefits 14 coverage and medical benefits coverage under the uniform group insurance 15 program for retired eligible employees or surviving spouses of retired eligible 16 employees and their dependents as provided in this chapter. The state shall 17 contribute monthly to the retiree health benefits fund an amount equal to one and 18 fifteen hundredths percent of the monthly salaries and wages of all participating 19 members of the highway patrolmen's retirement system under chapter 39-03.1, 20 and one and fifteen hundredths percent of the monthly salaries of all supreme or 21 district court judges who are participating members of the public employees 22 retirement system under chapter 54-52. Each governmental unit that contributes 23 to the public employees retirement system fund under section 54-52-06 or the 24 retirement plan under chapter 54-52.6 shall contribute monthly to the retiree health 25 benefits fund an amount equal to one and fifteen hundredths percent of the 26 monthly salaries or wages of all participating members of the public employees 27 retirement system under chapter 54-52 or chapter 54-52.6, except for nonteaching 28 employees of the superintendent of public instruction who elect to participate in the 29 public employees retirement system pursuant to section 54-52-02.13. For 30 nonteaching employees of the superintendent of public instruction who elect to 31 participate in the public employees retirement system pursuant to section

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1 54-52-02.13, the superintendent of public instruction shall contribute monthly to the 2 retiree health benefits fund an amount equal to three and one tenth twenty-five 3 hundredths percent of the monthly salaries or wages of those nonteaching 4 employee members, beginning on the first of the month following the transfer 5 under section 54-52-02.13 and continuing thereafter for a period of eight years, 6 after which time the superintendent of public instruction shall contribute one and 7 fifteen hundredths percent of the monthly salary or wages of those nonteaching 8 employee members. The employer of a national guard security officer or firefighter 9 shall contribute monthly to the retiree health benefits fund an amount equal to one 10 and fifteen hundredths percent of the monthly salaries or wages of all national 11 guard security officers or firefighters participating in the public employees 12 retirement system under chapter 54-52. Job service North Dakota shall reimburse 13 monthly the retiree health benefits fund for credit received under section 14 54-52.1-03.3 by members of the retirement program established by job service 15 North Dakota under section 52-11-01. The board, as trustee of the fund and in 16 exclusive control of its administration, shall: 17 Provide for the investment and disbursement of moneys of the retiree health a. 18 benefits fund and administrative expenditures in the same manner as moneys 19 of the public employees retirement system are invested, disbursed, or 20 expended. 21 Adopt rules necessary for the proper administration of the retiree health b. 22 benefits fund, including enrollment procedures. 23 SECTION 4. AMENDMENT. Subsection 2 of section 54-52.1-03.3 of the North Dakota 24 Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows: 25 The board shall calculate the allowable monthly credit toward hospital and medical 2. 26 benefits coverage for a person eligible under subsection 1 in an amount equal to 27 four five dollars and fifty cents multiplied by the member's or deceased member's 28 number of years of credited service under the highway patrolmen's retirement 29 system, the public employees retirement system, the retirement program 30 established by job service North Dakota under section 52-11-01, or the judges' 31 retirement program established under chapter 27-17. For a member of the public

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1 employees retirement system receiving an early retirement benefit or the surviving 2 spouse of that member, or a former participating member of the defined 3 contribution retirement plan who is receiving a periodic distribution and would not 4 meet the normal retirement provisions of the public employees retirement system, 5 the allowable monthly credit must be reduced by three percent if the member 6 terminates employment within one year prior to attaining the age of sixty-five and 7 an additional reduction factor of six percent shall apply for each year the member 8 terminates employment prior to attaining the age of sixty-four. For a member of 9 the highway patrolmen's retirement system receiving an early retirement benefit or 10 the surviving spouse of that member, the allowable monthly credit must be 11 reduced by three percent if the member terminates employment within one year 12 prior to attaining the age of fifty-five and an additional reduction factor of six 13 percent shall apply for each year the member terminates employment prior to 14 attaining the age of fifty-four. For a member of the retirement program established 15 by job service North Dakota under section 52-11-01 receiving an early retirement 16 benefit or a discontinued service annuity under the plan provisions of that 17 retirement program or the surviving spouse of that member, the allowable monthly 18 credit must be reduced by three percent if the member terminates employment 19 within one year prior to attaining the age of sixty-five and an additional reduction 20 factor of six percent applies for each year the member terminates employment 21 prior to attaining the age of sixty-four.
