- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 39-29-10 and 39-29-12 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to youth operation of off-highway vehicles; and to provide a penalty.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 39-29-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

39-29-10. Operation by persons under age sixteen. Except as otherwise provided in this section, a person an individual under sixteen years of age who is not in possession of a valid operator's license or permit to operate an all-terrain off-highway vehicle may not, except upon the lands of the person's individual's parent or quardian or as a participant in an organized sporting event that involves the use of off-highway vehicles, operate an all-terrain off-highway vehicle. A person An individual at least twelve ten years of age may operate an all terrain off-highway vehicle if the person individual has completed an all terrain off-highway vehicle safety training course prescribed by the director of the parks and recreation department and, has received the appropriate all-terrain off-highway vehicle safety certificate issued by the director of the department of transportation, and wears appropriate safety gear and attire. An individual at least eight years of age and under ten years of age may not operate an off-highway vehicle unless the vehicle is a class 1 with an engine of no more than seventy cubic centimeters and that individual has received an off-highway vehicle safety certificate. An individual at least ten years of age and under thirteen years of age may not operate an off-highway vehicle unless the vehicle is a class 1 or class 2 off-highway vehicle with an engine of no more than ninety cubic centimeters and that individual has received an off-highway vehicle safety certificate. An individual at least thirteen years of age and under sixteen years of age may not operate an off-highway vehicle unless the vehicle is a class 1 or class 2

off-highway vehicle and that individual has received an off-highway vehicle safety certificate.

- 1 An individual without a valid operator's license or permit may not operate a class 3 off-highway
- 2 <u>vehicle</u>. An individual under twelve years of age may not operate an off-highway vehicle
- 3 without the supervision of a legal guardian. The failure of an operator to exhibit an all-terrain
- 4 off-highway vehicle safety certificate on demand to any official authorized to enforce this
- 5 chapter is presumptive evidence that that person does not hold such a certificate. Fees
- 6 collected from each person individual receiving certification must be deposited in the all-terrain
- 7 off-highway vehicle trail tax fund for all-terrain off-highway vehicle safety education and training
- 8 programs.
- 9 **SECTION 2. AMENDMENT.** Section 39-29-12 of the North Dakota Century Code is
- 10 amended and reenacted as follows:
- **39-29-12. Penalties.** Violation of subdivision b, c, or g of subsection 5 of section
- 12 39-29-09 is a class B misdemeanor. Violation of any other provision of section 39-29-09 is an
- 13 infraction for which a fee of twenty dollars must be assessed. Violation of section 39-29-02 is
- 14 an infraction, for which a fee of fifty dollars must be assessed. If the individual provides proof of
- 15 registration since the violation, the fee may be reduced by one-half. Violation of any other
- 16 provision of this chapter is an infraction, for which a fee of ten twenty dollars must be assessed.
