4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. Dispute resolution - Custody and support of children. In addition to any other authority provided by law, the department of human services may provide assistance to parents in amicably resolving issues pertaining to custody and support of a child in a way that best serves the interests of the child and promotes a healthy relationship between the child and each parent. The assistance may include pilot programs involving creation of a child support obligor ombudsman program and improved access to legal resources by parents who do not have an attorney. In carrying out this section, the department of human services may employ staff, enter contracts with any public or private person, and incur expenses within the limits of legislative appropriation. The department of human services may create a fee schedule for services provided under this section and receive grants or donations from federal or private sources. As authorized under chapter 28-32, the department may adopt rules to implement this section.

SECTION 2. DISPUTE RESOLUTION SERVICES TO CHILDREN - REPORT TO SIXTY-FIRST LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY. The department of human services shall prepare and present a report to the appropriations committees of the sixty-first legislative assembly on the use of any funds appropriated under section 3 of this Act during the biennium beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2009.

SECTION 3. APPROPRIATION. There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$150,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, and any special funds derived from federal funds and other

- 2 Act, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2009.
- 3 SECTION 4. EXPIRATION DATE. This Act is effective through July 31, 2009, and
- 4 after that date is ineffective.
