- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 15.1-21 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to high school coursework requirements; and to amend and reenact
- 3 sections 15.1-01-02 and 15.1-21-02.1 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to high school
- 4 graduation requirements and student proficiency.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-01-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
  - of higher education Education standards and practices board State board for career and technical education. The state board of public school education, the state board of higher education, the education standards and practices board, and the state board for career and technical education shall meet together at least once each year at the call of the superintendent of public instruction, the commissioner of higher education, the executive

- 15 education for the purposes of:
  - Coordinating <u>Pursuing alignment between</u> elementary and secondary education programs, career and technical education programs, and higher education programs.
    - Cooperating in the provision of professional growth and development opportunities for elementary and secondary teachers and administrators.
- 21 3. Ensuring cooperation in any other jointly beneficial project or program.
- 4. Creating a system within which student proficiency is required and measured in
  order for students to enter high school, graduate from high school, enter an
  institution of higher education, and graduate from an institution of higher education.
