- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 53-06.2-02 and subsection 6 of section
- 2 53-06.2-11 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the racing commission and the
- 3 authority of the attorney general.

## 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 53-06.2-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is
6 amended and reenacted as follows:

## 53-06.2-02. Racing commission - Members - Appointment - Term - Qualifications Compensation.

9 A North Dakota racing commission is established consisting in the office of the 1. 10 attorney general. The commission is subject to the supervision and direction of the 11 attorney general, except with regard to the commission's authority to spend the 12 funds described in subsection 6 of section 53-06.2-11. The attorney general may 13 require payment for any services rendered to the commission. Payment for those 14 services must be deposited into the attorney general's operating fund. The 15 commission consists of the chairman and four other members appointed by the 16 governor. One of the members must be appointed from a list of four nominees, 17 one of whom is nominated by the state chapter or affiliate of the American guarter 18 horse racing association, one of whom is nominated by the state chapter or affiliate 19 of the United States trotting association, one of whom is nominated by the state 20 chapter or affiliate of the international Arabian horse association, and one of whom 21 is nominated by the state chapter or affiliate of the North Dakota thoroughbred 22 association. The members serve five-year terms and until a successor is 23 appointed and qualified. A member appointed to fill a vacancy arising from other 24 than the natural expiration of a term serves for the unexpired portion of the term

- and may be reappointed. The terms of the commissioners must be staggered so
   that one term expires each July first. At the expiration of the five-year term of each
   incumbent member of the commission, the governor shall appoint a new member
   to the commission.
- 5 2. A person is ineligible for appointment to the commission if that person has not 6 been a resident of this state for at least two years before the date of appointment. 7 A person is also ineligible if that person is not of such character and reputation as 8 to promote public confidence in the administration of racing in this state. A person 9 who has a financial interest in racing cannot be a member of the commission and 10 cannot be employed by the commission. Failure to maintain compliance with this 11 subsection is grounds for removal from the commission or from employment with 12 the commission. For purposes of this section, a person has a financial interest in 13 racing if that person has an ownership interest in horses running at live or 14 simulcast meets conducted or shown in this state subject to this chapter or rules of 15 the commission, is required to be licensed under this chapter or the rules of the 16 commission, or who derives any direct financial benefit from racing, individually or 17 by or through an entity or other person, as regulated by this chapter or the rules of 18 the commission.
- Commission members are entitled to seventy-five dollars per day for the same
   compensation, and mileage and expense reimbursement as allowed to other state
   employees provided for members of committees of the legislative council under
   section 54-35-10.

23 SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Subsection 6 of section 53-06.2-11 of the North Dakota
24 Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

6. The commission shall deposit the moneys received pursuant to subsections 1, 2, and 3 and from the North Dakota horse racing foundation pursuant to subsection 5 of section 53-06.2-05 in the breeders' fund, the purse fund, and the racing promotion fund. Moneys, and any earnings on the moneys, in the breeders' fund, purse fund, and racing promotion fund are appropriated to the commission on a continuing basis to carry out the purposes of those funds under this chapter and must be administered and disbursed in accordance with rules adopted by the

1	commission. The commission may not transfer money among the funds. The
2	commission shall distribute awards and payment supplements from the breeders'
3	fund in the same calendar year the money was earned by the recipient. The
4	commission shall distribute payments awarded to qualified owners and breeders
5	from the breeders' fund without requiring owners and breeders to apply for the
6	payments. The commission, upon approval of the emergency commission
7	attorney general, may receive no more than twenty-five percent of the racing
8	promotion fund for the payment of the commission's operating expenses.
