- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 25-13 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to killing or injuring a service animal; to amend and reenact sections
- 3 25-13-01.1, 25-13-02, 25-13-02.1, 25-13-03, 25-13-04, and 25-13-05 of the North Dakota
- 4 Century Code, relating to service animals; and to provide a penalty.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

6 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 25-13-01.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is 7 amended and reenacted as follows:

8	25- 1	3-01.1. Definitions. For purposes of this chapter:	
9	1.	"Assistance dog" includes a dog that has been specially trained to assist an	
10		individual with a disability. The term includes guide dogs that guide individuals	
11		who are legally blind, hearing dogs that alert individuals who are hard of hearing to	
12		specific sounds, and service dogs for individuals with disabilitics other than	
13		blindness or deafness. The term does not include a dog that is not trained to	
14		mitigate an individual's disability, but the presence of which is to provide for the	
15		comfort, protection, or personal defense of an individual.	
16	2.	"Service dogs" includes dogs "Service animal" means any guide dog, signal dog,	
17		or other animal trained to do work or perform a variety of physical tasks, including	
18		pulling for the benefit of an individual with a disability. The term includes an anima	
19		trained to provide protection services to an individual with a disability, pull a	
20		wheelchair, lending lend balance support, retrieving retrieve dropped objects, and	
21		providing or provide assistance in a medical crisis.	
22	SEC	CTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 25-13-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is	
23	amended and reenacted as follows:

7	SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 25-13-02.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is				
8	amended and reenacted as follows:				
9	25-13-02.1. Trainer and assistance dog a service animal in training - Admission

11	1.	A tra	ainer with an assistance dog a service animal in training may enter any place of		
12		pub	lic accommodation, common carrier, facility of a health care provider, and any		
13		plac	e to which the public is generally invited, without being required to pay an extra		
14		chai	rge for the assistance dog service animal in training, provided:		
15		a.	The trainer notifies an onsite manager that an assistance dog a service		
16			animal in training is being brought onto the premises;		
17		b.	The trainer wears a photo identification card issued by a nationally recognized		
18			dog service animal training program; and		
19		C.	The trainer is liable for any damage done to the premises or facility by the		
20			assistance dog service animal in training.		
21	2.	Upo	on receiving notice as provided in subsection 1, the onsite manager may not		
22		den	y admission to the trainer and the assistance dog service animal in training

24	SE	CTIO	N 4. AMENDMENT. Section 25-13-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is		
25	amended and reenacted as follows:				
26	25	-13-03	. Driver of motor vehicle - Precaution - Individual with assistance dog		
27	service ar	<u>nimal</u> .	If the driver of a motor vehicle approaches an individual who is blind or		
28	visually impaired and who is carrying a cane predominately white or metallic in color, with or				
29	without a red tip, or who is accompanied by an assistance dog a service animal, the driver shall				
30	take all reasonable precautions to avoid injury to the individual and the assistance dog service				
31	<u>animal</u> . Ai	ny driv	ver who fails to take reasonable precautions is liable to the individual for any

1 injury caused. An individual who is blind or visually impaired and not carrying a cane or an 2 individual with a disability who is not accompanied by an assistance dog a service animal has 3 all of the rights and privileges conferred by law upon other individuals. The failure of an 4 individual who is blind or visually impaired to carry a cane or the failure of an individual with a 5 disability to be accompanied by an assistance dog a service animal is not by itself evidence of 6 fault. 7 SECTION 5. AMENDMENT. Section 25-13-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is 8 amended and reenacted as follows: 9 25-13-04. Penalty for interfering or denying use of facilities. Any person who 10 denies or interferes with admittance to or enjoyment of the public places or facilities 11 enumerated in section 25-13-02 or otherwise interferes with the rights of an individual who is 12 blind or visually impaired, or with the rights of an individual who is accompanied by an 13 assistance dog a service animal, is guilty of a class A misdemeanor. This section does not 14 apply to a denial of admission under section 25-13-02.1. 15 **SECTION 6.** A new section to chapter 25-13 of the North Dakota Century Code is 16 created and enacted as follows: 17 Killing or injury of service animal - Penalty. 18 A person is guilty of a class A misdemeanor and is subject to a civil penalty of up to 1. 19 ten thousand dollars if that person willfully and unjustifiably kills, shoots, tortures, 20 torments, beats, kicks, strikes, mutilates, disables, or otherwise injures a service 21 animal. 22 A person is guilty of a class B misdemeanor and is subject to a civil penalty of up to 2. 23 five thousand dollars if that person willfully: 24 Harasses, taunts, or provokes a service animal; or a. 25 b. Interferes with a service animal while the animal is working. 26 This section does not apply to a veterinarian who terminates the life of a service 3. 27 animal to relieve the animal of undue suffering and pain. 28 **SECTION 7. AMENDMENT.** Section 25-13-05 of the North Dakota Century Code is 29 amended and reenacted as follows: 30 25-13-05. State employment of individuals who are blind and or otherwise 31 **disabled.** It is the policy of this state that the individuals who are blind, the visually

- 1 handicapped, and the impaired, or otherwise physically disabled shall be employed in the state
- 2 service, the service of the political subdivisions of the state, the public schools, and all other
- 3 employment supported in whole or in part by public funds on the same terms and conditions as
- 4 the able-bodied individuals who are not disabled, unless the particular disability prevents the
- 5 performance of the work involved.
