ENGROSSED SENATE BILL NO. 2068

1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 20.1-03-35 of the North Dakota Century Code,

2 relating to the use of social security numbers or other alternate unique identification numbers

3 on game and fish licenses and permits; to provide an agency directive; to provide an

4 appropriation; and to provide a contingent effective date.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

6 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 20.1-03-35 of the North Dakota Century Code is 7 amended and reenacted as follows:

8 20.1-03-35. Social security number or alternate unique identification number to
9 be furnished.

- <u>1.</u> The social security number <u>or alternate unique identification number</u> of an applicant for any license or permit issued under this chapter must be recorded on the application unless the applicant is a foreign national to whom no social security number has been issued. A social security number recorded under this section is confidential. <u>Beginning on January 1, 2008</u>,
- 15 <u>2.</u> <u>As used in this section, "alternate unique identification number" means:</u>
- 16a.An operator's license number, nondriver photo identification card number, or17instructional permit number issued to the applicant by the department of18transportation;
- 19b.A hunter education certificate number or other unique number issued to the20applicant by the director, if the applicant's social security number is already on21file with the director; or
- 22c.For any application that is printed in paper form for a resident or nonresident23fishing, hunting, or fur-bearer certificate must be printed in a manner so that24only, the last four digits of the applicant's social security number are recorded

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1 2 on the application, and the first five digits of the applicant's social security number are not recorded on the application.

3 SECTION 2. AGENCY DIRECTIVE. The department of human services shall seek a
4 federal exemption authorizing the state to implement section 1 of this Act.

SECTION 3. APPROPRIATION. There is appropriated out of any moneys in the
general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$150,000, or so much
of the sum as may be necessary, to the game and fish department for the purpose of
implementing section 1 of this Act, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, and ending
June 30, 2011.
SECTION 4. APPROPRIATION. There is appropriated out of any moneys in the

10 SECTION 4. APPROPRIATION. There is appropriated out of any moneys in the 11 general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$15,000, or so much 12 of the sum as may be necessary, to the department of human services for the purpose of 13 implementing section 1 of this Act, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, and ending 14 June 30, 2011.

SECTION 5. CONTINGENT EFFECTIVE DATE. Sections 1, 3, and 4 of this Act
become effective on the date the department of human services certifies to the game and fish
department and the legislative council that the United States department of health and human
services has granted the exemption requested in section 2 of this Act, or January 1, 2010,
whichever is later.
