- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact two new sections to chapter 54-60 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to the rural development office and the North Dakota rural development
- 3 council; to amend and reenact sections 10-30.5-04, 54-34.3-01, 54-34.3-03, and 54-34.3-04,
- 4 subsection 2 of section 54-34.3-13, sections 54-34.3-15, 54-34.4-01, and 54-34.4-02,
- 5 subsection 1 of section 54-34.4-03, section 54-60-03, subsection 3 of section 54-60-04, and
- 6 sections 54-60-06 and 54-60-17 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the powers of
- 7 the North Dakota Development Fund, Incorporated, the department of commerce division of
- 8 economic development and finance, the department of commerce division of tourism, the state
- 9 tourism policy, the commissioner of commerce, the North Dakota economic development
- 10 foundation, the North Dakota commerce cabinet, and the department of commerce division of
- 11 workforce development; and to repeal sections 54-34.3-05, 54-34.4-04, and 54-60-11 of the
- 12 North Dakota Century Code, relating to the finance office, the motion picture development
- 13 office, and target industries.

14 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 10-30.5-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 17 **10-30.5-04.** (Effective through July 31, 2009) Powers. The corporation must be
- 18 organized as a nonprofit corporation. In addition to the powers in chapter 10-33, the
- 19 corporation may:
- 20 1. Cooperate and contract with any private or public entity.
- 2. Receive appropriations from the legislative assembly and other public moneys as well as contributions from other private or public contributors.
- Borrow funds not to exceed ten million dollars from the Bank of North Dakota for
 the purpose of investing in North Dakota alternative and venture capital

1		investments and early stage capital funds. The corporation may provide Provide		
2		management services for the Bank's alternative and venture capital investments		
3		and early-stage capital funds.		
4	(Eff	ective after July 31, 2009) Powers. The corporation must be organized as a

9	SEC	CTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 54-34.3-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is		
10	amended a	nd reenacted as follows:		
11	54-3	34.3-01. Department of commerce division of economic development and		
12	finance est	tablished - Mission. The department of commerce division of economic		
13	developme	nt and finance is established to assume the functions, powers, and duties of the		
14	department of economic development and finance with respect to programs and other efforts			
15	intended to enhance the economic development of the state. The mission of the division is to			
16	develop strategies and programs to:			
17	1.	Facilitate the growth, diversification, and expansion of existing enterprises and the		
18		attraction and creation of new wealth-generating enterprises in the state;		
19	2.	Promote economic diversification and innovation within the basic industries and		
20		economic sectors of this state, including strategies and programs designed to		
21		specialize and focus the state's economy on advanced agriculture and food		
22		processing, energy byproduct development, export services and tourism, and		
23		advanced manufacturing identified target industries;		
24	3.	Promote increased productivity and value-added products, processes, and		
25		services in the state, and the export of those goods and services by North Dakota		
26		enterprises to the nation and to the world;		
27	4.	Maintain and revitalize economically depressed rural areas by working in close		
28		collaboration with local communities and by encouraging communities to enter into		
29		cooperative relationships for more efficient and effective education, health care,		
30		government service, and infrastructure maintenance;		

1 Forge a supportive partnership with the Bank of North Dakota, the board of higher 2 education and the state's institutions of higher education, regional planning 3 councils, local development organizations and authorities, the Myron G. Nelson 4 Fund, Incorporated, the state's nonprofit development corporations, and other 5 appropriate private and public sector organizations in achieving the economic 6 goals of the state; and 7 6. Identify those statutes, administrative rules, and policies that impede the attraction, 8 creation, and expansion of businesses and job creation in this state. 9 **SECTION 3. AMENDMENT.** Section 54-34.3-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows: 10 11 **54-34.3-03. Division structure.** The division consists of: 12 1. A finance office; 13 2 An international business and trade office; 14 3. Offices established by statute; and 15 4. 2. Offices the director organizes and establishes as necessary to carry out most 16 efficiently and effectively the mission and duties of the division. 17 SECTION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 54-34.3-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is 18 amended and reenacted as follows: 19 54-34.3-04. Director - Compensation - Duties. A director shall supervise and control 20 the division. The director shall: 21 1. Manage the internal operations of the division and establish policies that promote 22 the orderly and efficient administration of the division; 23 2. Appoint personnel as may be determined necessary to carry out this chapter and 24 fix their compensation within the limits of legislative appropriations: 25 3. Assume central responsibility to develop, implement, and coordinate within state 26 government a comprehensive program of economic development consistent with 27 the mission of the division; 28 Coordinate that program of economic development with all other appropriate state 4. 29 and local government departments, agencies, institutions, and organizations that 30 perform research, develop and administer programs, gather statistics, or perform 31 other functions relating to economic development, and those government entities

- shall advise, cooperate, and provide reasonable assistance to the director in carrying out this chapter;
 - 5. Advise, and cooperate with, departments and agencies of the federal government and of other states, private business and agricultural organizations and associations, research institutions, and any individual or other private or public entity, and call upon those entities or individuals for consultation and assistance in their respective fields of endeavor or interest in order that the division and the state may benefit from up-to-date technical advice, information, and assistance;
 - Cooperate with individuals and both public and private entities, including the state's
 congressional delegation, in identifying and pursuing potential sources of funding
 and to receive those funds to be expended for purposes consistent with this
 chapter;
 - 7. Have authority to enter into contracts upon terms and conditions as determined by the director to be reasonable and to effectuate the purposes of this chapter; and
 - 8. Identify and coordinate sources of capital and financial assistance, including lending programs of the Bank of North Dakota, and administer programs of financial assistance placed under the administration of the division, to business and industry, local governments, and other entities and individuals in the state consistent with the mission of the division; and
 - 9. Have authority to do any and all other things necessary and proper to carry out this chapter.
 - **SECTION 5. AMENDMENT.** Subsection 2 of section 54-34.3-13 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
 - 2. The department shall designate an applicant city as a rural growth incentive city eligible for a loan if the city raises funds in the amount of a dollar-for-dollar match for the amount requested in the loan, prepares an economic development strategic plan, and meets any additional program requirements provided by rule. The source of city funds used for loan matching funds may be any combination of public and private funds. If the department designates a city as a rural growth incentive city eligible for a loan under this section, subject to the availability of funds, the state shall make a loan to the city in an amount not less than twenty-five

thousand dollars and not more than seventy-five thousand dollars. The department shall establish the amount of the interest rate for loans provided to a city under this subsection. The funding source of the state loan is the North Dakota development fund. The city shall distribute the city and state funds to qualifying new or expanded primary sector businesses in the city. A qualifying business in the city includes a business that provides essential services to the city. For purposes of this subsection, a business that provides essential services does not include a public utility. The governing body of the city determines whether a new or expanded primary sector business qualifies for funding, and the director of the department determines whether a business that provides essential services to the city qualifies for funding. The state shall distribute a loan to a rural growth incentive city once the city establishes the city has chosen a specified qualified business to receive funding.

SECTION 6. AMENDMENT. Section 54-34.3-15 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

54-34.3-15. Local economic developer certification program and education programs. The director shall may implement a certification program and education programs through which the division provides training to assist local economic developers and community leaders in meeting the needs of businesses. The director may contract with a third-party service provider to assist in implementing the program. The director may set and charge a fee for the receipt of services under this program.

SECTION 7. AMENDMENT. Section 54-34.4-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

54-34.4-01. Division of tourism - Director. The division of tourism is established to foster and promote tourism to, and within, the state and the full development of the state's tourism resources and to serve as a planning and coordinating agency for tourism-related programs of the state and the state's political subdivisions tourism partners. The director shall supervise and control the division of tourism.

SECTION 8. AMENDMENT. Section 54-34.4-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

1 **54-34.4-02. Duties of director.** The director of the department of commerce division 2 of tourism, within the limits of legislative appropriations, shall: 3 1. Implement the state's tourism policy; 4 2. Prepare and update annually a tourism master marketing plan for the development 5 promotion and expansion of tourism in the state which identifies the state's tourism 6 resources, estimates the impact of tourism on the state's economy, and proposes 7 a five-year plan marketing strategy for activities of the division; 8 3. Work with industry groups to prepare a long-term strategic plan each biennium. 9 Measure and forecast visitor volume, receipts, and related social and economic 4. 10 impacts; 11 Work with the private sector and local, state, and federal agencies to develop the 4. <u>5.</u> 12 state's tourism-related infrastructure, facilities, services, and attractions, including 13 the state's highways and, parks, and historic sites; 14 Organize and coordinate programs designed to promote tourism to, and within, the 5. 6. 15 state through various means. Those means may include: 16 Display Print advertising in magazines and, newspapers, and direct mail: a. 17 Advertising on radio and, on television, online, in displays, or using other b. 18 advertising media; 19 Publishing pamphlets, brochures, and other graphic and pictorial materials; C. 20 and 21 d. 14			a.	This state is endowed with scenic beauty, historical sites, cultural resources,

The development and promotion of tourism to and within the state is in the 8 interest of the people of this state; 9 Tourism should develop in an orderly manner in order to provide the j. k. 10 maximum benefit to the state and its residents; 11 k. l. The development of a strong and competitive state visitor industry depends 12 upon the availability of trained personnel, necessary infrastructure, and a 13 receptive climate for tourism investment; and 14 A comprehensive tourism policy is essential if tourism in the state is to grow in l. m. 15 an orderly manner. 16 **SECTION 10. AMENDMENT.** Section 54-60-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is 17 amended and reenacted as follows: 18 54-60-03. Commissioner of commerce - Duties. With the advice and counsel of the 19 North Dakota development foundation, the governor shall appoint a commissioner to supervise, 20 control, and administer the department. The commissioner serves at the pleasure of the 21 governor and receives a salary set by the governor within the limits of legislative appropriations. 22 The commissioner: 23 1. Shall file an oath of office in the usual form before commencing to perform the 24 duties of the commissioner: 25 2. Shall serve as chairman of the cabinet; 26 3. Shall prepare the cabinet's list identifying economic development moneys included 27 in budget requests of cabinet agencies; 28 4. Shall appoint personnel as may be determined necessary to carry out the duties of 29 the department; 30 5. 4. Shall manage the operations of the department and oversee each of the divisions;

1 6. 5. Shall assume central responsibilities to develop, implement, and coordinate a 2 working network of commerce service providers; 3 7. 6. Shall coordinate the department's services with commerce-related services of 4 other state agencies; 5 Shall advise and cooperate with departments and agencies of the federal 8. 7. 6 government and of other states; private businesses, agricultural organizations, and 7 associations; research institutions; and with any individual or other private or public 8 entity: 9 May enter contracts upon terms and conditions as determined by the 9. 8. 10 commissioner to be reasonable and to effectuate the purposes of this chapter; 11 10. 9. Shall report between the first and tenth legislative days of each regular legislative 12 session to a standing committee of each house of the legislative assembly as 13 determined by the legislative council and shall report annually to the foundation: 14 On the department's goals and objectives since the last report; a. 15 b. On the department's goals and objectives for the period until the next report; 16 On the department's long-term goals and objectives; C. 17 d. Shall adopt rules necessary to implement this chapter; and 23 12. 11. May take any actions necessary and proper to implement this chapter. 24 **SECTION 11. AMENDMENT.** Subsection 3 of section 54-60-04 of the North Dakota 25 Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows: 26 The foundation shall seek funding for administrative expenses from private sector 27 sources and shall seek and distribute private sector funds for use in 28 commerce-related activities in of the state. 29 SECTION 12. AMENDMENT. Section 54-60-06 of the North Dakota Century Code is 30 amended and reenacted as follows:

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- 1 **54-60-06.** Commerce cabinet. The North Dakota commerce cabinet is created. The 2 cabinet is composed of the directors of each of the department divisions and of the executive 3 heads, or other authorized representatives, of the state board for career and technical 4 education, the state board of higher education, the Bank of North Dakota, the department of 5 agriculture, workforce safety and insurance, the department of transportation, job service North 6 Dakota, the game and fish department, and of any other state agency appointed by the 7 commissioner. The commissioner is the chairman of the cabinet and shall determine which 8 agencies are members of the cabinet. The cabinet shall: 9 Coordinate and communicate economic development and tourism efforts of the 10 agencies represented. 11 2. Meet at times determined by the commissioner. 12 3. Develop and make available before each regular session of the legislative 13 assembly a list that identifies economic development moneys included in budget 14 requests of cabinet agencies. 15 SECTION 13. AMENDMENT. Section 54-60-17 of the North Dakota Century Code is 16 amended and reenacted as follows: 17 54-60-17. Division of workforce development - Higher education internships 18 Internships, apprenticeships, and work experience opportunities. The division of 19 workforce development shall administer a program to increase use of higher education 20 internships, apprenticeships, and work experience opportunities for higher education students 21 and high school students enrolled in grade eleven or twelve. The primary focus of this program 22 must be higher education internships in target industries. This program shall provide services 23 to employers, communities, and business organizations to increase higher education 24 internship, apprenticeship, and work experience opportunities. 25 SECTION 14. A new section to chapter 54-60 of the North Dakota Century Code is 26 created and enacted as follows: 27 Rural development office. 28 The commissioner shall administer the rural development office. The purpose of 1. 29 the office is to assist in the development of rural North Dakota communities.
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The commissioner may contract with a third party for the provision of services for

the rural development office. If the commissioner contracts with a third party under

1		this subsection, all data and databases collected and created by the third party in
2		performing services for the office are the property of the department and the third
3		party.
4	<u>3.</u>	The department may seek and accept any gift, grant, or donation of funds,
5		property, services, or other assistance from public or private sources for the
6		purpose of furthering the objectives of the rural development office.
7	SEC	CTION 15. A new section to chapter 54-60 of the North Dakota Century Code is
8	created and	d enacted as follows:
9	Nor	th Dakota rural development council - Composition. The North Dakota rural
10	developme	nt council is created.
11	<u>1.</u>	The North Dakota rural development council is composed of a minimum of nine
12		and a maximum of seventeen members. The commissioner is an ex officio voting
13		member of the council. The governor shall appoint council members for two-year
14		terms, except the governor shall appoint approximately one-half of the initial
15		council members to one-year terms in order to initiate a cycle of staggered terms.
16		Appointment of the council members must ensure representation from eight
17		regions designated by the commissioner. Members of the council serve at the
18		pleasure of the governor.
19	<u>2.</u>	The council shall select its own officers who shall serve for a term of two years
20		commencing on October first of each year.
21	<u>3.</u>	The council shall have at least two meetings each year and such additional
22		meetings as the chairman determines necessary at a time and place to be fixed by
23		the chairman. Special meetings must be called by the chairman on written request
24		of any four members. A simple majority of the council constitutes a quorum and
25		may act upon any matter coming before the council. Members of the council are
26		entitled to reimbursement in the same manner and at the same rate provided by
27		law for other state officials.
28	<u>4.</u>	The council, in cooperation with the rural development office, shall:
29		a. Facilitate collaboration among federal, state, local, and tribal governments
30		and the private and nonprofit sectors in the planning and implementation of
31		programs and policies that have an impact on rural areas of the state;

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1	<u>b.</u>	Monitor, report, and comment on policies and programs that address, or fail to
2		address, the needs of the rural areas of the state; and
3	<u>C.</u>	Facilitate the development of strategies to reduce or eliminate conflicting or
4		duplicative administrative or regulatory requirements of federal, state, local,
5		and tribal governments.
6	SECTIO	N 16. REPEAL. Sections 54-34.3-05, 54-34.4-04, and 54-60-11 of the North
7	Dakota Century	Code are repealed.
