- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact chapter 39-29.2 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 2 relating to unconventional vehicles; and to amend and reenact subdivision c of subsection 3 of
- 3 section 39-06-14 and subsection 3 of section 39-27-05 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 4 relating to motorcycles.

## 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

6	SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Su	bdivision c of subsection 3 of section 39-06-14 of the
7	North Dakota Century Code is amended	and reenacted as follows:

- c. A driver with a class M license may operate any motor vehicle having a seat
  or saddle for the use of the rider and designed to travel on not more than
  three wheels in contact with the ground, but excluding motorized bicycles;
  and tractors, and vehicles on which the operator or passengers, or both, ride
  within an enclosed cab. A class M vehicle may not be operated under a
  class A, B, C, or D license.
- 14(1)The holder of a class A, B, C, or D license may receive a class M15endorsement upon successful completion of an examination. The16director may waive the skill portion of the examination if the applicant17has successfully completed a motorcycle safety course approved by18the director.
- 19(2)An applicant sixteen years of age and older, who does not hold a20current valid operator's license may be issued a class M learner's21permit after successful completion of a written examination. The22class M license will be issued after the applicant has successfully23completed a driver's examination. The director may waive the skill

1		portion of the examination if the applicant has successfully completed a	
2		motorcycle safety course approved by the director.	
3	(3)	Applicants fourteen or fifteen years of age may be issued a motorcycle	
4		learner's permit if the applicant is enrolled in or has completed an	
5		approved motorcycle safety course. Applicants for a motorcycle	
6		operator's license who are under sixteen years of age shall hold an	
7		initial learner's permit for at least two months before applying for a	
8		class M operator's license, shall have completed an approved	
9		motorcycle safety course, and shall hold a valid motorcycle learner's	
10		permit at the time of application. The director may waive the skill	
11		portion of the examination if the applicant has successfully completed a	
12		motorcycle safety course approved by the director. Any person under	
13		sixteen years of age who holds a permit or license is restricted to the	
14		operation of a motorcycle powered with an engine of two hundred fifty	
15		cubic centimeters, or less, displacement. Evidence that the applicant	
16		has satisfactorily completed a motorcycle safety course which meets	
17		the minimum requirements of the motorcycle safety foundation must	
18		accompany the application.	
19	SECTION 2. AM	MENDMENT. Subsection 3 of section 39-27-05 of the North Dakota	
20	Century Code is amend	ed and reenacted as follows:	
21	3. Wheel rim of	diameters may not be less than ten inches [25.4 centimeters] or

9		mounted at least twenty-four inches [50.8 centimeters] from the ground, has a
10		steering device for front wheel steering control, is capable of speeds in excess of
11		sixty-five miles [104.61 kilometers] per hour, complies with equipment listed in
12		chapter 39-21 or 39-27, as appropriate, and has an identifying number. The term
13		does not include motor vehicles that otherwise may be registered under this title.

6		motorcycle.
7	<u>8.</u>	Funds collected from registration must be deposited in the motor vehicle
8		registration fund.
