- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 39-03.1-10 and 39-03.1-11.3, subsection 9 of
- 2 section 52-09-20, sections 54-52-06, 54-52-17.5, 54-52-17.11, and 54-52-17.13, and
- 3 subsection 2 of section 54-52.6-09 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to employer
- 4 contributions, cost-of-living adjustments, and supplemental retiree payments under the highway
- 5 patrolmen's retirement system, old-age and survivor insurance trust fund, and the public
- 6 employees retirement system; and to provide an appropriation.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

8 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 39-03.1-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is 9 amended and reenacted as follows:

10 **39-03.1-10.** Contributions by the state. The state shall contribute to the fund a sum 11 equal to sixteen and seventy-hundredths percent of the monthly salary or wage of a 12 participating member; however, the state shall contribute an amount equal to twenty-two and 13 four-hundredths percent of the monthly salary or wage of a participating member from July 1, 14 2009, through June 30, 2011. If the member's contribution is paid by the state under 15 subsection 2 of section 39-03.1-09, the state shall contribute, in addition, an amount equal to 16 the required member's contribution. The state shall pay the associated employer contribution 17 for those members who elect to exercise their rights under subsection 3 of section 18 39-03.1-10.1. 19 SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 39-03.1-11.3 of the North Dakota Century Code

20 is amended and reenacted as follows:

39-03.1-11.3. Supplemental retiree benefit payment. If the board determines that
the fund has obtained a total return on investments of nine and six hundredths percent or higher
for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2007, or June 30, 2008, the <u>The</u> board shall authorize an
additional increase the monthly payment equal to seventy five percent of the January

2	January, including joint and survivor and term certain beneficiaries, under this chapter. The			
3	board may only make one payment under this section. individual or the individual's beneficiary			
4	receiving benefit payments under this chapter by two percent of the individual's present benefits			
5	with the increase payable beginning January 2011. The board shall also authorize a one-time			
6	supplemental retiree benefit to each eligible retiree in pay status as of January 1, 2010,			
7	including joint and survivor and term certain beneficiaries, based on one of the following			
8	options:			
9	<u>1.</u>	No additional payment if the board determines that the fund has obtained a total		
10		return on investments equal to, or less than, eight percent for the fiscal year ending		
11		June 30, 2009, or the highway patrolmen's retirement system funding ratio is equal		
12		to or less than a market value of one hundred five percent.		
13	<u>2.</u>	An additional payment equal to fifty percent of the January retirement allowance		
14		following the fiscal yearend if the board determines that the fund has obtained a		
15		total return on investments greater than eight percent for the fiscal year ending		
16		June 30, 2009, and the highway patrolmen's retirement system funding ratio is		
17		greater than a market value of one hundred five percent.		
18	<u>3.</u>	An additional payment equal to seventy-five percent of the January retirement		
19		allowance following the fiscal yearend if the board determines that the fund has		
20		obtained a total return on investments greater than nine percent for the fiscal year		
21		ending June 30, 2009, and the highway patrolmen's retirement system funding		
22		ratio is greater than a market value of one hundred ten percent.		
23	<u>4.</u>	An additional payment equal to one hundred percent of the January retirement		
24		allowance following the fiscal yearend if the board determines that the fund has		
25		obtained a total return on investments greater than ten percent for the fiscal year		
26		ending June 30, 2009, and the highway patrolmen's retirement system funding		
27		ratio is greater than a market value of one hundred fifteen percent.		
28	SEC	CTION 3. AMENDMENT. Subsection 9 of section 52-09-20 of the North Dakota		
29	Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:			
30	9.	"Primary insurance benefit" means the sum of the following:		

1	a.	(1)	Fifty percent of the amount of an individual's average monthly wage if	
2			the average monthly wage does not exceed seventy-five dollars; or	
3		(2)	If the average monthly wage exceeds seventy-five dollars, thirty-seven	
4			dollars and fifty cents, plus fifteen percent of the amount by which the	
5			average monthly wage exceeds seventy-five dollars and does not	
6			exceed two hundred fifty dollars;	
7	b.	One	percent of the amount computed under subdivision a, multiplied by the	
8	number of years in which two hundred dollars or more of wages were paid			
9	the individual; and			
10	с.	(1)	Effective August 1, 2005, nine hundred thirty three dollars and	
11			twenty-eight cents; or	
12		(2)	Effective August 1, 2006 2009, nine hundred fifty-nine dollars one	
13			thousand seven and ninety-four cents.	
14	SECTIO	N 4. A	MENDMENT. Section 54-52-06 of the North Dakota Century Code is	
15	amended and reenacted as follows:			
16	54-52-06. Employer's contribution to retirement plan. Each governmental unit shall			
17	contribute an amount equal to four and twelve-hundredths percent of the monthly salary or			
18	wage of a participating member; however, each governmental unit shall contribute an amount			
19	equal to five and forty-two hundredths percent of the monthly salary or wage of a participating			
20	member from July 1, 2009, through June 30, 2011. For those members who elect to exercise			
21	their rights under section 54-52-17.14, the employing governmental unit, or in the case of a			
22	member not presently under covered employment the most recent employing governmental			
23	unit, shall pay the associated employer contribution. If the employee's contribution is paid by			
24	the governmental unit under subsection 3 of section 54-52-05, the employer unit shall			
25	contribute, in addition, an amount equal to the required employee's contribution. Each			
26	governmental unit shall pay the contribution monthly, or in the case of an election made			
27	pursuant to section 54-52-17.14 a lump sum, into the retirement fund from its funds			
28	appropriated for payroll and salary or any other funds available for these purposes. Any <u>A</u>			
29	governmental unit failing to pay the contributions monthly, or in the case of an election made			
30	pursuant to section 54-52-17.14 a lump sum, is subject to a civil penalty of fifty dollars and, as			
31	interest, one percent of the amount due for each month of delay or fraction thereof after the			

1 payment became due. In lieu of assessing a civil penalty or one percent per month, or both, 2 interest at the actuarial rate of return may be assessed for each month the contributions are 3 delinquent. If contributions are paid within ninety days of the date they became due, penalty 4 and interest to be paid on delinquent contributions may be waived. An employer is required to 5 submit contributions for any past eligible employee who was employed after July 1, 1977, for 6 which contributions were not made if the employee would have been eligible to become vested 7 had the employee participated and if the employee elects to join the public employees 8 retirement system. Employer contributions may not be assessed for eligible service that an 9 employee has waived pursuant to subsection 1 of section 54-52-05. The board shall report to 10 each session of the legislative assembly the contributions necessary, as determined by the 11 actuarial study, to maintain the fund's actuarial soundness.

SECTION 5. AMENDMENT. Section 54-52-17.5 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 amended and reenacted as follows:

14 54-52-17.5. Postretirement adjustments. An individual or the individual's beneficiary 15 who, on July 31, 2001 January 1, 2011, is receiving retirement benefits under subdivision a, c, 16 d, or e of subsection 4 of section 54-52-17 and who has three or more years of employment 17 with an employer that is participating under this section is entitled to receive an increase in 18 benefits equal to six two percent of the individual's present benefits with the increase payable 19 beginning August 1, 2001 January 2011. Participation by political subdivision employers under 20 this section is optional, at the discretion of each political subdivision. If a political subdivision 21 employer participates in more than one plan administered by the public employees retirement 22 system, that employer must make an election as to participation under each individual plan. If a 23 political subdivision employer chooses not to participate under this section, the employer 24 contribution will not increase during the period from July 1, 2009, through June 30, 2011, as 25 provided under section 54-52-06, and the retirees and beneficiaries of the political subdivision 26 are not entitled to receive increased benefits under this section. A political subdivision 27 employer election to participate under this section, before July 1, 2009, is only subject to the 28 increased employer contribution rates under section 54-52-06. A political subdivision employer 29 that has not made an election to participate before July 1, 2009, may elect to participate at any 30 time before July 1, 2010, provided the political subdivision employer agrees to pay contributions 31 in accordance with section 54-52-06, plus interest at eight percent of contributions on payroll

from July 1, 2009, to the date of election. If an election is not made by July 1, 2010, the political
 subdivision employer is presumed to have made an election not to participate.

3 SECTION 6. AMENDMENT. Section 54-52-17.11 of the North Dakota Century Code is
4 amended and reenacted as follows:

5 54-52-17.11. Judges postretirement adjustments. A supreme or district court judge 6 or that person's beneficiary who, on December 31, 2007 January 1, 2011, is receiving 7 retirement benefits under subdivision b of subsection 4 of section 54-52-17, is entitled to 8 receive an increase in benefits equal to two percent of the individual's present benefits with the 9 increase payable beginning January 1, 2008. A supreme or district court judge or that person's 10 beneficiary who, on December 31, 2008, is receiving retirement benefits under subdivision b of 11 subsection 4 of section 54-52-17, is entitled to receive an increase in benefits equal to two 12 percent of the individual's present benefits with the increase payable beginning January 1, 2009 13 January 2011. The increases allowed by this section may only be given if the public employees 14 retirement board determines there is actuarial margin sufficient to pay the increases.

SECTION 7. AMENDMENT. Section 54-52-17.13 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 amended and reenacted as follows:

17 54-52-17.13. Supplemental retiree benefit payment. If the board determines that the 18 fund has obtained a total return on investments of nine and six hundredths percent or higher for 19 the fiscal year ending June 30, 2007, or June 30, 2008, the board shall authorize an additional 20 payment equal to seventy five percent of the January retirement allowance following the fiscal 21 yearend to each eligible retiree in pay status as of that January, excluding judicial retirees and 22 beneficiaries, but including joint and survivor and term certain beneficiaries, under this chapter. 23 The board may only make one payment to each retiree under this section. The board shall 24 authorize a one-time supplemental retiree benefit to each eligible retiree in pay status as of 25 January 1, 2010, including judicial retirees and beneficiaries, and also including joint and 26 survivor and term certain beneficiaries, based on one of the following options: 27 No additional payment if the board determines that the fund has obtained a total 1.

return on investments equal to, or less than, eight percent for the fiscal year ending
 June 30, 2009, or the public employees retirement system funding ratio is equal to
 or less than a market value of one hundred five percent.

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1	<u>2.</u>	An additional payment equal to fifty percent of the January retirement allowance
2		following the fiscal yearend if the board determines that the fund has obtained a
3		total return on investments greater than eight percent for the fiscal year ending
4		June 30, 2009, and the public employees retirement system funding ratio is greater
5		than a market value of one hundred five percent.
6	<u>3.</u>	An additional payment equal to seventy-five percent of the January retirement
7		allowance following the fiscal yearend if the board determines that the fund has
8		obtained a total return on investments greater than nine percent for the fiscal year
9		ending June 30, 2009, and the public employees retirement system funding ratio is
10		greater than a market value of one hundred ten percent.
11	<u>4.</u>	An additional payment equal to one hundred percent of the January retirement
12		allowance following the fiscal yearend if the board determines that the fund has
13		obtained a total return on investments greater than ten percent for the fiscal year
14		ending June 30, 2009, and the public employees retirement system funding ratio is
15		greater than a market value of one hundred fifteen percent.
16	SEC	CTION 8. AMENDMENT. Subsection 2 of section 54-52.6-09 of the North Dakota
17	Century Co	de is amended and reenacted as follows:
18	2.	The employer shall contribute an amount equal to four and twelve-hundredths
19		percent of the monthly salary or wage of a participating member; however, an
20		employer shall contribute an amount equal to five and forty-two hundredths percent
21		of the monthly salary or wage of a participating member from July 1, 2009, through
22		June 30, 2011. If the employee's contribution is paid by the employer under
23		subsection 3, the employer shall contribute, in addition, an amount equal to the
24		required employee's contribution. The employer shall pay monthly such
25		
23		contribution into the participating member's account from its funds appropriated for
