## FIRST ENGROSSMENT with Senate Amendments ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL NO. 1029

## 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact four new sections to chapter 54-06 of the North Dakota

- 2 Century Code, relating to state employee service awards, employer-paid tuition, and
- 3 employer-paid professional organization membership and service club dues.

## 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 54-06 of the North Dakota Century Code is 6 created and enacted as follows:

7 State employee service awards. Each state agency, department, or institution may 8 establish rules or policies for employee recognition and service award programs. Executive 9 branch agencies having employees in classified service are subject to rules adopted by North 10 Dakota human resource management services and approved by the state personnel board and 11 the legislative council's administrative rules committee. Any other agency, department, or 12 institution of the executive, legislative, or judicial branch may adopt similar rules or policies to 13 ensure uniformity and consistency in state government. Notwithstanding any other provision of 14 law, each executive branch state agency, department, or institution, except an institution of 15 higher education, having employees who are not in classified service and establishing rules or 16 policies for employee recognition and service award programs shall submit the rules and 17 policies to the office of management and budget for review and comment, and after addressing 18 any comments of the office of management and budget, shall submit the rules and policies to 19 the legislative council's administrative rules committee for approval. Within sixty days after the 20 close of each biennial period, each state agency, department, or institution providing an 21 employee service award under rules approved by the administrative rules committee shall file 22 with the office of management and budget a report indicating the individuals receiving a service 23 award, the amount paid, and a statement of the public purpose or benefit of the expenditures. 24 Within ninety days after the close of each biennial period, the office of management and budget Sixty-first Legislative Assembly

1 shall submit to the legislative council a report summarizing this information. An expenditure 2 made under this section is deemed to be made for a public purpose and may not be construed 3 as a gift for purposes of section 18 of article X of the Constitution of North Dakota. 4 **SECTION 2.** A new section to chapter 54-06 of the North Dakota Century Code is 5 created and enacted as follows: 6 **Employer-paid tuition.** Each state agency, department, or institution may establish 7 rules or policies to provide employer-paid costs of training or educational courses, including 8 tuition and fees, within budgetary constraints. Executive branch agencies having employees in 9 classified service are subject to rules adopted by North Dakota human resource management 10 services and approved by the state personnel board and the legislative council's administrative 11 rules committee. Any other state agency, department, or institution of the executive, legislative, 12 or judicial branch may adopt rules or policies to ensure uniformity and consistency in state 13 government. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, each executive branch state agency, 14 department, or institution, except an institution of higher education, having employees who are 15 not in classified service and establishing rules or policies for employer-paid costs of training or 16 educational courses, including tuition and fees, shall submit the rules and policies to the office 17 of management and budget for review and comment, and after addressing any comments of 18 the office of management and budget, shall submit the rules and policies to the legislative 19 council's administrative rules committee for approval. Within sixty days after the close of each 20 biennial period, each state agency, department, or institution providing employer-paid costs of 21 training or educational courses, including tuition and fees, under rules approved by the 22 administrative rules committee, shall file with the office of management and budget a report 23 indicating the individuals receiving employer-paid costs of training or educational courses, 24 including tuition and fees; the amount paid; and a statement of the public purpose or benefit of 25 the expenditure. Within ninety days after the close of each biennial period, the office of 26 management and budget shall submit to the legislative council a report summarizing this 27 information. An employee who receives employer-paid tuition reported under this section who 28 leaves employment with that employer within two years of receiving the tuition must repay 29 tuition received under this section on a prorated basis. An expenditure for employer-paid 30 training or educational courses, including tuition and fees, under this section is deemed to be

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- 1 made for a public purpose and may not be construed as a gift for purposes of section 18 of
- 2 article X of the Constitution of North Dakota.
- 3 SECTION 3. A new section to chapter 54-06 of the North Dakota Century Code is
  4 created and enacted as follows:
- 5 Employer-paid professional organization membership and service club dues.
- 6 Each state agency, department, or institution may pay employee membership dues for
- 7 professional organizations and membership dues for service clubs when required to do
- 8 business or if the membership is primarily for the benefit of the state. Within sixty days after the
- 9 close of each biennial period, each executive branch state agency, department, or institution,
- 10 except an institution of higher education, providing employer-paid professional organization
- 11 membership and service club dues shall file with the office of management and budget a report
- 12 indicating the individuals receiving employer-paid professional organization membership and
- 13 service club dues, the amount paid, and a statement of the public purpose or benefit of the
- 14 expenditure. Within ninety days after the close of each biennial period, the office of
- 15 management and budget shall submit to the legislative council a report summarizing this
- 16 information. An expenditure made under this section is deemed to be made for a public
- 17 purpose and may not be construed as a gift for purposes of section 18 of article X of the
- 18 <u>Constitution of North Dakota.</u>
- SECTION 4. A new section to chapter 54-06 of the North Dakota Century Code is
   created and enacted as follows:
- Expenditure made pursuant to rule or policy. An expenditure made pursuant to a
   rule or policy adopted pursuant to sections 1 through 3 of this Act is not a criminal offense.
