- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 23-27 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to regulation of emergency medical services operation dispatch; and to
- 3 amend and reenact section 23-27-02, subsection 1 of section 23-27-04, and section 23-27-04.7
- 4 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the definition of emergency medical services,
- 5 emergency medical services operation licensure standards, and distribution of property tax
- 6 revenues to emergency medical services operations.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 8 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 23-27-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is 9 amended and reenacted as follows:
- 23-27-02. **Definitions.** For the purpose of this chapter, unless the context otherwise requires:
- 1. "Department" means the state department of health.
 - 2. "Emergency medical services" means the prehospital medical stabilization and or transportation of individuals an individual who are is sick, injured, wounded, or otherwise incapacitated or helpless, or in a real or perceived acute medical condition, by emergency medical services personnel with physician oversight a person that holds oneself out to the public as being in that service or that regularly provides that service. The term includes assessing,:
 - <u>Assessing</u>, stabilizing, and treating life-threatening and non-life-threatening medical conditions; or
 - <u>b.</u> Transporting a patient who is in a real or perceived acute medical condition to
 <u>a hospital emergency room.</u>
 - 3. "Emergency medical services operation" means an entity licensed to offer and provide emergency medical services by emergency medical services personnel

4	4.	"En	nergency medical services personnel" means individuals who provide
5		eme	ergency medical services for emergency medical services operations. The term
6		incl	udes emergency medical services professionals, drivers, and
7		dep	artment-certified emergency medical services providers, such as
8		car	diopulmonary resuscitation drivers and first responders.
9	5.	"En	nergency medical services professional" means an individual licensed by the
10		dep	artment as an emergency medical technician-basic, emergency medical
11		tech	nnician-intermediate, or emergency medical technician-paramedic.

13	Century Co	de is	amended and reenacted as follows:
14	1.	An	emergency medical services operation within this state may not operate unless
15		the	operation is licensed in accordance with this chapter and rules adopted by the
16		stat	e health council. The rules must include:
17		a.	Time when operator's services must be available.
18		b.	Type of motor vehicle operator's license needed for drivers of ground
19			vehicles.
20		c.	Training standards for operation personnel.
21		d.	Equipment and ground vehicle standards.
22		e.	Annual license fees.
23		f.	Number of personnel required for each run.
24		g.	The scope of practice for uncertified drivers, certified personnel, and
25			emergency medical services professionals.
26		h.	Performance standards, which may include response time standards.
27		<u>i.</u>	Other requirements as may be found necessary to carry out the intent of this
28			chapter.
29	SEC	CTIO	N 3. AMENDMENT. Section 23-27-04.7 of the North Dakota Century Code is
30	amended and reenacted as follows:		

1	23-2	27-04.7. Study of standards of reasonable coverage - County reporting - Use	
2	of property	tax levies.	
3	1.	During the 2007-08 interim, the state health council shall study the minimum	
4		requirements of reasonable emergency medical services coverage which must	
5		take into account the response time for emergency medical services. Before	
6		July 1, 2008, the state health officer shall report to the legislative council the	
7		outcome and recommendations of this study.	
8	2.	The board of county commissioners of every county in this state shall conduct an	
9		annual review of the emergency medical services coverage within that county and	
10		shall submit an annual report to the state health officer in a format approved by the	
11		state department of health.	
12	3.	A taxing district that levies property taxes for support of emergency medical	
13		services shall ensure that every emergency medical services operation that	
14		operates has portions of its service area in that taxing district receives a benefit	
15		portion of the revenue from this tax which is equal to the revenue from mills levied	
16		for emergency medical services in the townships covered by the emergency	
17		medical services operation.	
18	SECTION 4. A new section to chapter 23-27 of the North Dakota Century Code is		
19	created and enacted as follows:		
20	Eme	ergency medical services operation communications. The department may	
21	regulate the communications methods and protocols for emergency medical services		
22	operations.
