- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact three new sections to chapter 15-62.2 of the North
- 2 Dakota Century Code, relating to opportunity grants for students attending certain institutions of
- 3 higher education; to amend and reenact section 15.1-01-02 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 4 relating to joint meetings of the state's education boards; to provide a transfer; and to provide
- 5 an appropriation.

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6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 7 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 15-62.2 of the North Dakota Century Code is 8 created and enacted as follows:
- 9 Opportunity grant Eligibility. A student is eligible for an opportunity grant if the 10 student:
 - 1. Was a resident of this state for the twelve months preceding the date the student met the graduation or high school diploma requirements set forth in subsection 2;
- 13 <u>2. During or after the 2010-11 school year:</u>
- 14 <u>a. Graduated from a public or nonpublic high school in this state;</u>
 - b. Graduated from a high school in another state under chapter 15.1-29; or
 - c. Met the requirements for a high school diploma through home education, in accordance with section 15.1-23-17;
 - Completed the requirements for a merit scholarship with technical honors or a
 merit scholarship with academic honors, as set forth in House Bill No. 1400, as
 enacted by the sixty-first legislative assembly;
- 21 <u>4. Submitted an application for an opportunity grant to the state board of higher</u>
 22 education; and
- 5. a. <u>Is enrolled in an institution of higher education under the control of the state</u>
 board of higher education;

1		b. Is a "full-time" student, as defined by the institution;
2		c. Is enrolled in an associate or baccalaureate program; and
3		d. Maintains a minimum 3.0 cumulative grade point average.
4	SEC	CTION 2. A new section to chapter 15-62.2 of the North Dakota Century Code is
5	created and enacted as follows:

7	<u>1.</u>	Beginning with the 2010-11 school year, if a student who is eligible for an
8		opportunity grant enrolls in an institution of higher education under the control of
9		the state board of higher education, the board shall forward to the enrolling
10		institution, on behalf of the student, an amount equal to one thousand dollars per
11		semester.
12	<u>2.</u>	A student is not entitled to receive more than eight thousand dollars under
13		section 1 of this Act.
14	<u>3.</u>	Section 1 of this Act does not require a student to be enrolled in consecutive
15		semesters. However, an opportunity grant is valid for only six academic years
16		after the student's graduation from high school and may not be applied to graduate
17		programs.
18	SEC	CTION 3. A new section to chapter 15-62.2 of the North Dakota Century Code is

23	SEC	CTION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-01-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is
24	amended a	nd reenacted as follows:
25	15.1	I-01-02. Joint meetings - State board of public school education - State board
26	of higher e	ducation - Education standards and practices board - State board for career
27	and techni	cal education. The state board of public school education, the state board of
28	higher education, the education standards and practices board, and the state board for career	
29	and technical education shall meet together at least once each year at the call of the	
30	superintendent of public instruction, the commissioner of higher education, the executive	

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- 1 director of the education standards and practices board, and the director of career and
- 2 technical education for the purposes of:
- 1. Coordinating elementary and secondary education programs, career and technical education programs, and higher education programs-;
 - 2. <u>Establishing high standards and expectations of students at all levels of the</u> education continuum;
 - 3. Ensuring that all students have access to challenging curricula;
- 4. Ensuring that the individuals instructing students at all levels of the education
 continuum are highly qualified and capable;
 - <u>5</u>. Cooperating in the provision of professional growth and development opportunities for elementary and secondary teachers and administrators. <u>individuals instructing</u> students at all levels of the education continuum; and
 - 3. 6. Ensuring cooperation in any other jointly beneficial project or program.
 - **SECTION 5. STUDENT LOAN PROGRAMS TRANSFER DISTRIBUTION.** The industrial commission shall transfer \$3,800,000 from any profits that have accrued as a result of the Bank of North Dakota administering the student loan programs under section 15-62.2-01 to the general fund in the state treasury.
 - **SECTION 6. APPROPRIATION.** There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$3,800,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the state board of higher education for the purpose of providing opportunity grants under section 2 of this Act, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, and ending June 30, 2011.
