REENGROSSED SENATE BILL NO. 2062

- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact three new sections to chapter 15-62.2 of the North
- 2 Dakota Century Code, relating to opportunity grants for students attending certain institutions of
- 3 higher education; to amend and reenact subsections 1 and 3 of section 15-10-37 and sections
- 4 15-62.2-02 and 15.1-01-02 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to student financial
- 5 assistance grants, technology grants, and joint meetings of the state's education boards; to
- 6 provide for a legislative council study; to provide an appropriation; to provide an expiration date;
- 7 and to declare an emergency.

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8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Subsections 1 and 3 of section 15-10-37 of the North Dakota Century Code are amended and reenacted as follows:
 - 1. The state board of higher education shall administer a <u>science</u>, technology, <u>engineering</u>, and <u>mathematics</u> occupations student loan program that encourages college students to pursue <u>technology based</u> studies <u>in these fields</u>, to participate in <u>technology</u> internship programs, and to remain in the state after graduation. The board shall adopt rules to implement the program, including internship requirements, guidelines to determine which technology-related courses of study are eligible under the program, and standards <u>for of</u> eligibility <u>for primary sector</u> employment.
 - 3. The state board of higher education shall distribute student loan grants directly to the Bank of North Dakota to repay outstanding student loan principal balances for eligible applicants. The maximum student loan grant amount for which an applicant may qualify is ene two thousand dollars per year and a total of five ten thousand dollars, or a lesser amount established by rule adopted by the state board of higher education.

5		education or an accredited private higher education institution; and

9		b. Is a "full-time" student, as defined by the institution;

12	SEC	CTION 4. A new section to chapter 15-62.2 of the North Dakota Century Code is		
13	created and	reated and enacted as follows:

15	<u>1.</u>	Beginning with the 2010-11 school year, if a student who is eligible for an		
16		opportunity grant enrolls in an institution of higher education, the board shall		
17		forward to the enrolling institution, on behalf of the student, an amount equal to		
18		one thousand two hundred dollars per semester.		
19	<u>2.</u>	A student is not entitled to receive more than eight thousand eight hundred dollars		
20		under section 3 of this Act.		
21	<u>3.</u>	Section 3 of this Act does not require a student to be enrolled in consecutive		
22		semesters. However, an opportunity grant is valid for only six academic years		
23		after the student's graduation from high school and may not be applied to graduate		
24		programs.		
25	SECTION 5. A new section to chapter 15-62.2 of the North Dakota Century Code is			
26	created and enacted as follows:			
27	<u>Anr</u>	ual report. The state board of higher education shall provide to the legislative		
28	council an annual report regarding the number of grants provided under section 4 of this Act			
29	and demographic information pertaining to the recipients.			
30	SECTION 6. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-01-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is			
31	amended and reenacted as follows:			

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1	15.1	-01-02. Joint meetings - State board of public school education - State board			
2	of higher e	ducation - Education standards and practices board - State board for career			
3	and techni	cal education. The state board of public school education, the state board of			
4	higher educ	cation, the education standards and practices board, and the state board for career			
5	and technic	al education shall meet together at least once each year at the call of the			
6	superintendent of public instruction, the commissioner of higher education, the executive				
7	director of t	he education standards and practices board, and the director of career and			
8	technical education for the purposes of:				
9	1.	Coordinating elementary and secondary education programs, career and technical			
10		education programs, and higher education programs-;			
11	2.	Establishing high standards and expectations of students at all levels of the			
12		education continuum;			
13	<u>3.</u>	Ensuring that all students have access to challenging curricula;			
14	<u>4.</u>	Ensuring that the individuals instructing students at all levels of the education			
15		continuum are highly qualified and capable;			
16	<u>5</u> .	Cooperating in the provision of professional growth and development opportunities			
17		for elementary and secondary teachers and administrators. individuals instructing			
18		students at all levels of the education continuum; and			
19	3. <u>6.</u>	Ensuring cooperation in any other jointly beneficial project or program.			
20	SECTION 7. LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL STUDY - HIGHER EDUCATION STUDENT				
21	TRUST FU	ND. During the 2009-10 interim, the legislative council shall consider studying the			
22	establishment of a higher education student trust fund, including available funding sources.				
23	The study, if conducted, must review best practices to include demonstrated in-migration				
24	patterns and long-term return on investment to the citizens of North Dakota by ensuring				
25	students are prepared to meet the changing needs of a global economy and to strengthen the				
26	economy of the state. The legislative council shall report its findings and recommendations,				
27	together with any legislation required to implement the recommendations, to the sixty-second				
28	legislative assembly.				
29	SECTION 8. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the				
30	funds as ma	ay be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state			

treasury, not otherwise appropriated, to the state board of higher education for the purpose of

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- 1 implementing student financial aid programs, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, and
- 2 ending June 30, 2011, as follows:
- 3 Needs-based financial aid program \$20,000,000
- 4 Opportunity grants 4,000,000
- 5 STEM student loan forgiveness <u>1,000,000</u>
- 6 Total general fund appropriation \$25,000,000
- 7 **SECTION 9. EXPIRATION DATE.** Section 1 of this Act is effective through June 30,
- 8 2011, and after that date is ineffective.
- 9 **SECTION 10. EMERGENCY.** Section 2 of this Act is declared to be an emergency
- 10 measure.
