- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact three new sections to chapter 15-62.2 of the North
- 2 Dakota Century Code, relating to merit scholarships for students attending certain institutions of
- 3 higher education; to amend and reenact subsections 1 and 3 of section 15-10-37 and sections
- 4 15-62.2-02 and 15.1-01-02 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to student financial
- 5 assistance grants, technology grants, and joint meetings of the state's education boards; to
- 6 provide for a legislative council study; to provide an appropriation; to provide an expiration date;
- 7 and to declare an emergency.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 9 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Subsections 1 and 3 of section 15-10-37 of the North 10 Dakota Century Code are amended and reenacted as follows:
 - 1. The state board of higher education shall administer a <u>science</u>, technology, <u>engineering</u>, and <u>mathematics</u> occupations student loan program that encourages college students to pursue technology based studies <u>in these fields</u>, to participate in technology internship programs, and to remain in the state after graduation. The board shall adopt rules to implement the program, including internship requirements, guidelines to determine which technology-related courses of study are eligible under the program, and standards for <u>of</u> eligibility <u>for primary sector employment</u>.
 - 3. The state board of higher education shall distribute student loan grants directly to the Bank of North Dakota to repay outstanding student loan principal balances for eligible applicants. The maximum student loan grant amount for which an applicant may qualify is one thousand <u>five hundred</u> dollars per year and a total of <u>five six</u> thousand dollars, or a lesser amount established by rule adopted by the state board of higher education.

1	SEC	CTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 15-62.2-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is	
2	amended and reenacted as follows:		
3	15-6	62.2-02. State board of higher education - Powers and duties. The state board	
4	of higher ed	ducation shall:	
5	1.	Administer the North Dakota student financial assistance program and the North	
6		Dakota scholars program and adopt functional rules regarding the eligibility and	
7		selection of grant and scholarship recipients.	
8	2.	Determine the amount of individual grants, but which may not to exceed one	
9		thousand five hundred dollars per recipient per academic year, under the North	
10		Dakota student financial assistance program.	
11	3.	Adopt for For the North Dakota student financial assistance program, adopt criteria	
12		for substantial need, based upon the ability of the parents or guardian to contribute	
13		toward the applicant's educational expenses.	
14	4.	Establish the appropriate procedures for fiscal control, fund accounting, and	
15		necessary reports.	
16	5.	Apply for, receive, expend, and administer granted moneys from federal or private	
17		sources.	
18	SEC	CTION 3. A new section to chapter 15-62.2 of the North Dakota Century Code is	
19	created and enacted as follows:		
20	<u>Mer</u>	rit scholarship - Eligibility. A student is eligible for a merit scholarship if the	
21	student:		
22	<u>1.</u>	Was a resident of this state for the twelve months preceding the date the student	
23		met the graduation or high school diploma requirements set forth in subsection 2;	
24	<u>2.</u>	During or after the 2010-11 school year:	
25		a. Graduated from a public or nonpublic high school in this state;	
26		b. Graduated from a high school in another state under chapter 15.1-29; or	
27		c. Met the requirements for a high school diploma through home education, in	
28		accordance with section 15.1-23-17;	
29	<u>3.</u>	Completed the requirements for a merit scholarship with technical honors or a	
30		merit scholarship with academic honors, as set forth in House Bill No. 1400, as	
31		enacted by the sixty-first legislative assembly;	

1	4. Submitted an application for a merit scholarship to the state board of higher		
2		education; and	
3	<u>5.</u>	a. Is enrolled in an associate or a baccalaureate program at an accredited publi	
4		or private institution of higher education in this state;	
5		b. Is a "full-time" student, as defined by the institution; and	
6		c. Maintains a minimum 2.75 cumulative grade point average.	
7	SEC	CTION 4. A new section to chapter 15-62.2 of the North Dakota Century Code is	
8	created and enacted as follows:		
9	Mer	it scholarship - Amount payable.	
10	<u>1.</u>	Beginning with the 2010-11 school year, the board shall forward to the institution is	
11		which an eligible student is enrolled, on behalf of the student, an amount equal to	
12		seven hundred fifty dollars per semester.	
13	<u>2.</u>	A student is not entitled to receive more than six thousand dollars under section 3	
14		of this Act.	
15	<u>3.</u>	Section 3 of this Act does not require a student to be enrolled in consecutive	
16		semesters. However, a merit scholarship is valid for only six academic years afte	
17		the student's graduation from high school and may not be applied to graduate	
18		programs.	
19	SEC	CTION 5. A new section to chapter 15-62.2 of the North Dakota Century Code is	
20	created and enacted as follows:		
21	<u>Anr</u>	ual report. The state board of higher education shall provide to the legislative	
22	council an a	annual report regarding the number of scholarships provided under section 4 of this	
23	Act and demographic information pertaining to the recipients.		
24	SEC	CTION 6. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-01-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is	
25	amended a	nd reenacted as follows:	
26	15.1	-01-02. Joint meetings - State board of public school education - State board	
27	of higher education - Education standards and practices board - State board for career		
28	and technical education. The state board of public school education, the state board of		
29	higher educ	eation, the education standards and practices board, and the state board for career	
30	and technic	al education shall meet together at least once each year at the call of the	
31	superintend	lent of public instruction, the commissioner of higher education, the executive

- 1 director of the education standards and practices board, and the director of career and
- 2 technical education for the purposes of:
- Coordinating elementary and secondary education programs, career and technical
 education programs, and higher education programs-;
 - Establishing high standards and expectations of students at all levels of the education continuum;
 - 3. Ensuring that all students have access to challenging curricula;
- 4. Ensuring that the individuals instructing students at all levels of the education
 continuum are highly qualified and capable;
 - 5. Cooperating in the provision of professional growth and development opportunities for elementary and secondary teachers and administrators. individuals instructing students at all levels of the education continuum; and
 - 3. 6. Ensuring cooperation in any other jointly beneficial project or program.

SECTION 7. LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL STUDY - HIGHER EDUCATION STUDENT

- 15 **TRUST FUND.** During the 2009-10 interim, the legislative council shall consider studying the
- 16 establishment of a higher education student trust fund, including available funding sources.
- 17 The study, if conducted, must review best practices to include demonstrated in-migration
- 18 patterns and long-term return on investment to the citizens of North Dakota by ensuring
- 19 students are prepared to meet the changing needs of a global economy and to strengthen the
- 20 economy of the state. The legislative council shall report its findings and recommendations,
- 21 together with any legislation required to implement the recommendations, to the sixty-second
- 22 legislative assembly.
- 23 **SECTION 8. APPROPRIATION.** The funds provided in this section, or so much of the
- 24 funds as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state
- 25 treasury, not otherwise appropriated, to the state board of higher education for the purpose of
- 26 implementing student financial aid programs, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, and
- 27 ending June 30, 2011, as follows:
- 28 Needs-based financial aid program \$21,000,000
- 29 Merit scholarships 3,000,000
- 30 STEM student loan forgiveness 1,000,000
- 31 Total general fund appropriation \$25,000,000

- 1 The state board of higher education may use up to \$50,000 of the amount appropriated in this
- 2 section for merit scholarships to cover expenses incurred as a result of administering the merit
- 3 scholarship program.
- 4 **SECTION 9. EXPIRATION DATE.** Section 1 of this Act is effective through June 30,
- 5 2011, and after that date is ineffective.
- 6 **SECTION 10. EMERGENCY.** Section 2 of this Act is declared to be an emergency
- 7 measure.
