1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 20.1-03 of the North Dakota

2 Century Code, relating to provisional hunting licenses; to amend and reenact section

3 20.1-03-01.1, subsection 1 of section 20.1-03-11, subsection 3 of section 20.1-03-12, and

4 section 20.1-03-12.1 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to hunting licenses and

5 requirements; and to provide an appropriation.

## 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 20.1-03-01.1 of the North Dakota Century Code
is amended and reenacted as follows:

9 20.1-03-01.1. Director to appoint and train instructors - Prescribe course material 10 and classroom sites - Certify completion. The director shall provide classroom instruction 11 on, and shall select, train, and certify persons or department personnel qualified to provide 12 instruction on, firearms and bow safety and hunter responsibility, and shall prescribe the course 13 material to be used, classroom locations, and the dates for teaching the course in this state. 14 The director shall also provide an online internet hunter safety education program for 15 individuals age eighteen and over to complete the hunter safety education requirement. The 16 director shall authorize the issuance of a certificate of completion to all persons satisfactorily 17 completing the course. 18 SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Subsection 1 of section 20.1-03-11 of the North Dakota 19 Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows: 20 1. No person shall An individual may not hunt, kill, take, or attempt to take any big 21 game without having the appropriate big game hunting license and a locking seal 22 bearing a number corresponding to the number of the big game hunting license or 23 stamp. The locking seal shall must be issued as an integral part of the big game 24 hunting license. No person Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, an

1	individual may not apply for or be issued a big game hunting license if that
2	person's individual's fourteenth birthday does not occur on or before the opening
3	date of the respective big game hunting season. However, an individual may apply
4	for and be issued a deer hunting license if that person's twelfth birthday occurs on
5	or before the opening date of deer hunting season. An individual may only receive
6	one license to hunt deer under this provision in a lifetime. This age limitation does
7	not apply to applicants for big game licenses for hunting by bow and arrow. Each
8	violation of this section shall be is a distinct and separate offense.

9 SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Subsection 3 of section 20.1-03-12 of the North Dakota
10 Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

For Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, for a resident big game
 hunting license, twenty dollars, except the fee for a licensee under age sixteen is
 ten dollars, except as provided in a gubernatorial proclamation issued pursuant to
 section 20.1-08-04.1. There is no fee for a doe license issued to an individual
 under sixteen years of age.

SECTION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 20.1-03-12.1 of the North Dakota Century Code
is amended and reenacted as follows:

20.1-03-12.1. Habitat restoration stamp required - Use of revenue - Land

19 purchases not allowed. Except for licenses issued under section 20.1-03-07.3 and as otherwise provided in this section, a habitat restoration stamp is required for every resident and 20 21 nonresident general game license for which a stamp fee of ten dollars must be charged. There 22 is no fee for a habitat restoration stamp issued to a resident under sixteen years of age. The 23 habitat restoration stamp fee is in addition to the annual general game license fee charged 24 under section 20.1-03-12. Land may not be purchased with habitat restoration stamp moneys. 25 All moneys generated by habitat restoration stamp fees must be placed in the game and fish 26 private land habitat and access improvement fund with five dollars of the fee allocated to the 27 private land open to sportsmen program.

SECTION 5. A new section to chapter 20.1-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is
created and enacted as follows:

30 Provisional license for hunters over eighteen years of age. The director shall
 31 establish a provisional license for hunters over eighteen years of age. A provisional license

- 1 issued under this section entitles an individual to hunt during any two seasons for which
- 2 licenses are not issued by lottery. An individual hunting with a provisional license issued under
- 3 this section may only hunt under the direct supervision of an individual over eighteen years of
- 4 age who has completed the hunter safety education program under sections 20.1-03-01.1 and
- 5 <u>20.1-03-01.2</u>. The director may not charge a fee for a provisional license issued under this
- 6 section.

SECTION 6. APPROPRIATION - GRANTS. There is appropriated out of any moneys
in the game and fish fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$60,000,
or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the game and fish department for the purpose
of carrying out a grant program to encourage hunting by youths, for the biennium beginning
July 1, 2009, and ending June 30, 2011. The director of the game and fish department may
provide grants under this program to local communities to fund shooting ranges and other
related activities to encourage hunting by youth.
