- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 15.1-19-02 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 2 relating to corporal punishment.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

4 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 15.1-19-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is 5 amended and reenacted as follows:

- 6 15.1-19-02. Corporal punishment Prohibition Consistent policies.
- A school district employee may not inflict, cause to be inflicted, or threaten to inflict
 corporal punishment on a student.
- 9 2. This section does not prohibit a school district employee from using the degree of
- 10 force necessary:
- a. To quell a physical disturbance that threatens physical injury to an individual
 or damage to property;
- 13 b. To quell a verbal disturbance;
- 14 c. For self-defense;
- 15 d. For the preservation of order; or
- 16 e. To obtain possession of a weapon or other dangerous object within the17 control of a student.
- 183.For purposes of this section, corporal punishment means the willful infliction of19physical pain on a student; willfully causing the infliction of physical pain on a20student; or willfully allowing the infliction of physical pain on a student. Physical21pain or discomfort caused by athletic competition or other recreational activities22voluntarily engaged in by a student is not corporal punishment. A school board23may not expand through policy the definition of corporal punishment beyond that
- 24 provided by this subsection.

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1	4.	The board of each school district shall develop policies setting forth standards for
2		student behavior and procedures to be followed if the standards are not met. The
3		board shall ensure that the policies governing all elementary schools in the district
4		are identical and consistently applied, that the policies governing all middle schools
5		in the district are identical and consistently applied, and that the policies governing
6		all high schools in the district are identical and consistently applied.
