- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 15.1-21-02.2 of the North Dakota Century
- 2 Code, relating to inclusion of the Declaration of Independence and the United States
- 3 Constitution in the high school social studies curriculum.

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- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA: 5 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-21-02.2 of the North Dakota Century Code 6 is amended and reenacted as follows: 7 15.1-21-02.2. High school coursework requirements. 8 Beginning with the 2008-09 school year, no A student may not graduate from a 9 high school in this state unless the student demonstrates successful completion of 10 the following: 11 Four units of English language arts; a. 12 Two units of mathematics; b. 13 Two units of science; C. 14 d. Three units of social studies, including: 15 (1) One-half unit of United States government or problems of democracy, 16 with a requirement that each student read the Declaration of
 - Independence and the United States Constitution; and
 - Two and one-half additional social studies units, which may include (2)one-half unit of North Dakota studies and one-half unit of multicultural studies;
 - One unit of physical education, which may include up to one-half unit of e. health; and
 - f. One unit of a foreign or native American language, fine arts, or career and technical education.

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- The superintendent of public instruction shall work with each school district to
 identify course offerings that meet the requirements of subdivisions a through f of
 subsection 1.
 - 3. Before September first of each year, each school district shall file a copy of its graduation requirements with the superintendent of public instruction.
 - 4. A school district may not reduce its graduation requirements below those in existence on June 30, 2007.

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
