- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 15.1-21-02.2 of the North Dakota Century
- 2 Code, relating to inclusion of the Declaration of Independence and the United States
- 3 Constitution in the high school social studies curriculum.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-21-02.2 of the North Dakota Century Code

6 is amended and reenacted as follows:

15.1-21-02.2. High school coursework requirements.

- Beginning with the 2008-09 school year, no <u>A</u> student may <u>not</u> graduate from a
 high school in this state unless the student demonstrates successful completion of
 the following:
- 11 a. Four units of English language arts;
- 12 b. Two units of mathematics;
- 13 c. Two units of science;
- 14 d. Three units of social studies, which which may include one-half unit of North
 15 Dakota studies and one-half unit of multicultural studies including:
 - (1) One unit of United States history;

 (2) (a)
 One-half unit of United States government and one-half unit of

 economics, with a requirement that each student read the

- 21(b)One unit of problems of democracy, with a requirement that each22student read the Declaration of Independence, the United States23Constitution, and the Bill of Rights; and

1		(3) One unit or two one-half units of any other social studies, which may
2		include civics, civilization, geography and history, multicultural studies,
3		North Dakota studies, psychology, sociology, and world history;
4		e. One unit of physical education, which may include up to one-half unit of
5		health; and
6		f. One unit of a foreign or native American language, fine arts, or career and
7		technical education.
8	2.	The superintendent of public instruction shall work with each school district to
9		identify course offerings that meet the requirements of subdivisions a through f of
10		subsection 1.
11	3.	Before September first of each year, each school district shall file a copy of its
12		graduation requirements with the superintendent of public instruction.
13	4.	A school district may not reduce its graduation requirements below those in
14		existence on June 30, 2007.
