- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 44-08 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to preferences for North Dakota food products.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 44-08 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:

 North Dakota food products Preference Alternate purchasing methods.

 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, a political subdivision purchasing food products shall provide a preference for food products grown or produced in this state.
 - A political subdivision may elect to purchase its food products through the use of a
 bidding procedure or may forego the bidding procedure and purchase the food
 products directly from a vendor in this state.
 - a. If the political subdivision elects to purchase food products through a bidding procedure, the political subdivision may enter into a contract under which the price to be paid for a food product grown or produced in this state exceeds the price offered by other bidders, provided:
 - (1) The quality of the food product is similar to that of products available from other states or countries;
 - (2) The vendor is able to supply the requisite amount of the food product; and
 - (3) The political subdivision has sufficient resources available to pay the higher price.
 - b. If the political subdivision elects to purchase food products directly from a vendor in this state, the political subdivision may enter into a contract under
