- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 39-08 and a new paragraph to
- 2 subdivision b of subsection 3 of section 39-06.1-10 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating
- 3 to a penalty for failure to submit to testing; to amend and reenact sections 39-06.1-06,
- 4 39-08-03.1, 39-08-09, 39-08-22, and 39-09-01 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to
- 5 fees for traffic offenses; and to provide a penalty.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 39-06.1-06 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 9 **39-06.1-06. Amount of statutory fees.** The fees required for a noncriminal disposition pursuant to either section 39-06.1-02 or 39-06.1-03 must be as follows:
- 1. For a nonmoving violation as defined in section 39-06.1-08, a fee of any amount not to exceed twenty dollars.
- 2. For a moving violation as defined in section 39-06.1-09, a fee of twenty thirty
 dollars, except for:
 - a. A violation of section 39-10-26, 39-10-26.2, 39-10-41, 39-10-42, 39-10-46, or 39-10-46.1, a fee of fifty seventy-five dollars.
 - A violation of section 39-10-05 involving failure to yield to a pedestrian or subsection 1 of section 39-10-28, a fee of <u>fifty seventy-five</u> dollars.
 - c. A violation of section 39-21-41.2, a fee of twenty-five forty dollars.
- d. A violation of subsection 1 of section 39-12-02, a fee of one two hundred dollars.
- e. A violation of subdivision d of subsection 1 of section 39-12-04, a fee of one two hundred dollars.

For a violation of a highway construction zone speed limit under subsection 2 of 26 section 39-09-02, a fee of eighty dollars for one through ten miles per hour over the 27 posted speed; and eighty dollars plus two dollars for each mile per hour over ten 28 miles per hour over the limit, unless a greater fee would be applicable under this 29 section. The fee in this subsection does not apply to a highway construction zone 30 unless individuals engaged in construction are present at the time and place of the

violation and the posted speed limit sign states "Minimum Fee \$80".

1 **SECTION 2.** A new paragraph to subdivision b of subsection 3 of section 39-06.1-10 of 2 the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows: 3 Refusal to submit 36 points 4 to a chemical test requested 5 by a law enforcement 6 officer 7 **SECTION 3.** A new section to chapter 39-08 of the North Dakota Century Code is 8 created and enacted as follows: 9 Refusal to submit to testing - Penalty. An individual who refuses to submit to a chemical test at the request of a law enforcement officer as allowed to be requested by this title 10 11 is guilty of a class B misdemeanor. 12 **SECTION 4. AMENDMENT.** Section 39-08-03.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is 13 amended and reenacted as follows: 14 39-08-03.1. Exhibition driving and drag racing - Definitions - Penalty. 15 No person An individual may not engage in exhibition driving of any vehicle on a 16 highway, street, alley, sidewalk, or any public or private parking lot or area, nor 17 may any person an individual engage in a race, a speed competition, drag race or 18 acceleration contest, test of physical endurance, or exhibition of speed or 19 acceleration. Any person An individual who violates this section by engaging in an 20 act defined by subdivision b of subsection 2 must be assessed a fee of fifty 21 seventy-five dollars. Any person who violates this section by engaging in an act 22 defined by subdivision a or c of subsection 2 must be assessed a fee of ene two 23 hundred dollars. 24 2. As used in this section: 25 "Drag race" means the operation of two or more vehicles from a point side by 26 side by accelerating rapidly in a competitive attempt to cause one vehicle to 27 outdistance the other; or the operation of one or more vehicles over a 28 common selected course from the same point to the same point for the 29 purpose of comparing the relative speed or powers of acceleration of such 30 vehicle or vehicles within a certain distance or time limit.

- b. "Exhibition driving" means driving a vehicle in a manner which disturbs the peace by creating or causing unnecessary engine noise, tire squeal, skid, or slide upon acceleration or braking; or driving and executing or attempting one or a series of unnecessarily abrupt turns.
- c. "Race" means the use of one or more vehicles in an attempt to outgain, outdistance, or to arrive at a given distance ahead of another vehicle or vehicles; or the use of one or more vehicles to willfully prevent another vehicle from passing the racing vehicle or vehicles, or to test the physical stamina or endurance of the persons driving the vehicles over a long-distance driving route.
- 3. Nothing in this <u>This</u> section shall be construed as prohibiting does not prohibit drag racing, exhibition driving, or similar events when carried out in an organized manner on a track or other privately owned area specifically set aside and used solely for <u>such these</u> purposes by drivers of motor vehicles, including snowmobiles.

SECTION 5. AMENDMENT. Section 39-08-09 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

39-08-09. Immediate notice of accident - Penalty.

The driver of a vehicle involved in an accident resulting in injury to or death of any person an individual, or property damage to an apparent extent of at least one thousand five hundred dollars, shall immediately give notice of the accident to the local police department if the accident occurs within a municipality, otherwise to the office of the county sheriff or the state highway patrol. Any person A driver who violates this section must be assessed a fine of fifty one hundred dollars. The name of the motor vehicle insurance policy carrier and the policy number of the driver, or if the driver is not the owner of the vehicle, then the motor vehicle insurance policy carrier and the policy number of the owner of the vehicle, must be furnished to the law enforcement officer investigating the accident. If the driver does not have the required information concerning insurance to furnish to the investigating law enforcement officer, then within five days of the accident the

1 driver shall supply that information to the driver's license division in the form the 2 division requires. 3 The director may suspend the license or permit to drive and any nonresident 4 operating privileges of any person failing to comply with the duties as provided in 5 sections 39-08-06 through 39-08-09 until those duties have been fulfilled, and the 6 director may extend the suspension not to exceed thirty days. 7 SECTION 6. AMENDMENT. Section 39-08-22 of the North Dakota Century Code is 8 amended and reenacted as follows: 9 39-08-22. Nonpayment for motor fuels - Penalty. 10 For a theft offense in violation of chapter 12.1-23 which involves a person who 11 leaves the premises of an establishment at which motor fuel is offered for retail 12 sale after motor fuel was dispensed into the fuel tank of a motor vehicle that that 13 person drove away without having made due payment or authorized charge for the 14 motor fuel dispensed, the court may: 15 Upon a person's second first conviction, order the suspension of the person's 16 driving privileges for up to three months; and 17 b. Upon a person's third second or subsequent conviction, order the suspension 18 of the person's driving privileges for up to six months. 19 2. As used in this section, "conviction" means a final conviction without regard to 20 whether sentence was suspended or deferred or probation was granted after the 21 conviction. Forfeiture of bail, bond, or collateral deposited to secure a defendant's 22 appearance in court, which forfeiture has not been vacated, is equivalent to 23 conviction. 24 SECTION 7. AMENDMENT. Section 39-09-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is 25 amended and reenacted as follows: 26 39-09-01. Basic rule - Penalty for violation. 27 No person An individual may not drive a vehicle at a speed greater than is 1. 28 reasonable and prudent under the conditions and having regard to the actual and 29 potential hazards then existing. Consistent with the foregoing, every person and 30 shall drive at a safe and appropriate speed when approaching and crossing an

intersection or railroad grade crossing, when approaching and going around a

- curve, when approaching a hill crest, when traveling upon any narrow or winding roadway, and when special hazards exist with respect to pedestrians or other traffic or by reason of weather or highway conditions. Any person An individual who drives a vehicle upon a highway or private or public property open to the public for the operation of motor vehicles without heed to the requirements or restrictions of this section has committed careless driving and must be assessed a fee of thirty fifty dollars.
- 2. Any person An individual who, by reason of careless driving as herein defined in subsection 1, causes and inflicts bodily injury upon the person of to an operator of snow removal equipment engaged in snow removal operations or causes damage in excess of one thousand dollars to snow removal equipment engaged in snow removal is guilty of an infraction.
- 3. As used in this section, "snow removal equipment" means a vehicle that is operated by a person an individual employed by or on behalf of an authority in charge of the maintenance of the highway to perform winter maintenance snow and ice removal, including plowing, hauling away, salting, and sanding.
