- 1 A BILL for an Act to establish a mentorship grant program and an instructional coaching pilot
- 2 project.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 4 SECTION 1. MENTORSHIP GRANT PROGRAM - FUNDING - DISTRIBUTION. The 5 superintendent of public instruction shall provide funding within the limits of legislative 6 appropriations to the education standards and practices board, which shall administer a 7 mentorship grant program for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, and ending June 30, 2011. 8 The education standards and practices board is authorized to hire a mentoring coordinator to 9 oversee and evaluate the program and to develop and support an advisory committee to assist 10 in program oversight. The education standards and practices board shall select and train 11 mentor teachers who shall provide support to increase instructional skills of protege teachers. 12 Protege teachers must be in their first year of service as an elementary or secondary teacher.
- 13 Funding may be used to pay for staff, training, evaluation costs, stipends to participating
- 14 mentors and proteges, as well as other costs determined necessary by the education standards
- and practices board for the administration of the program.

16 SECTION 2. INSTRUCTIONAL COACHING PILOT PROJECT - FUNDING -

- 17 **DISTRIBUTION.** The superintendent of public instruction shall provide funding within the limits
- 18 of legislative appropriations to no less than three pilot programs of instructional coaching during
- 19 the 2010-11 school year for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, and ending June 30, 2011.
- 20 State funds must be matched on a one-to-one basis by grant recipients. The superintendent of
- 21 public instruction shall develop grant criteria to award grants to multidistrict or single-district pilot
- 22 programs to employ instructional coaches in school districts. Criteria may include the
- 23 employment of highly qualified instructional coaches, teacher involvement, and methods
- 24 employed to evaluate program effectiveness.
