- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subsection 1 of section 15.1-21-02 and section
- 2 15.1-21-02.1 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to personal finance as a required high
- 3 school unit; and to provide an effective date.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Subsection 1 of section 15.1-21-02 of the North Dakota
6 Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

- In order to be approved by the superintendent of public instruction, each public and
 nonpublic high school shall make available to each student:
- 9 a. Four units of English language arts;
- 10 b. Four units of mathematics;
- 11 c. Four units of science;
- d. Four units of social studies, including one of world history and one of United
 States history;
- 14 e. <u>One-half unit of personal finance;</u>
- 15 <u>f.</u> One-half unit of health;
- 16f. g.One-half unit of physical education during each school year, provided that17once every four years the unit must be a concept-based fitness class that18includes instruction in the assessment, improvement, and maintenance of19personal fitness;
- 20 g. <u>h.</u> Two units of fine arts, at least one of which must be music;
- 21 h. i. Two units of the same foreign language; and
- 22 i. j. Two units of career and technical education.

23 SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-21-02.1 of the North Dakota Century Code

24 is amended and reenacted as follows:

16			(2) Two one-half units of any other science;

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- 1 <u>7.</u> <u>One-half unit of personal finance; and</u>
- 2 <u>8.</u> <u>Any four and one-half additional units</u>.
- 3 SECTION 3. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act becomes effective on July 1, 2010.
