- 1 A BILL for an Act to provide for the creation of an ethanol council; to provide a penalty; and to
- 2 provide a continuing appropriation.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 4 **SECTION 1. Definitions.** As used in this Act:
 - 1. "Council" means the North Dakota ethanol council.
 - 2. "Producer" means the owner of a facility that is located in this state an which produces annually more than one million gallons of agriculturally derived denatured ethanol that is suitable for blending with a petroleum product for use internal combustion engines.
- 10 **SECTION 2.** Council Membership Election Term.
 - 1. The council consists of one individual appointed by each producer.
- - 3. The term of each member is four years and begins on April first following the members' appointment. The terms must be staggered by the council to ensure that an approximately equal number of appointments expire each year.
 - 4. If at any time during a member's term the member ceases to possess any of the qualifications provided by this section, the member's office is deemed vacant and the producer who appointed that member shall appoint another qualified individual for the remainder of the term.
- 5. A member may not serve more than two consecutive terms. If an individual is appointed to complete a vacancy, that service is not counted as a term for purposes of this section unless the duration of that service exceeds one year.

9	SECTION 5. Council - Powers.		
10	<u>1.</u>	The council may:	
11		<u>a.</u>	Expend moneys collected pursuant to this chapter for its administration;
12		<u>b.</u>	Employ, bond, and compensate necessary personnel;
13		<u>C.</u>	Accept gifts, grants, and donations of money, property, and services to carry
14			out this chapter;
15		<u>d.</u>	Contract with any person for any purpose permitted under this chapter;
16		<u>e.</u>	Sue and be sued; and
17		<u>f.</u>	Do all things necessary and proper to enforce and administer this chapter.
18	<u>2.</u>	The	council may not engage in a commercial business enterprise.
19	SECTION 6. Council - Duties.		
20	<u>1.</u>	The	council shall determine the uses to which any moneys raised under this

22		<u>a.</u>	The funding of research, education programs, promotion, and market
23			development efforts; and
24		<u>b.</u>	The support of state, regional, national, and international entities that promote
25			ethanol utilization.

27		the	ethanol assessment and ways in which the assessment benefits producers.

- Legislative Assembly 1 Each producer shall calculate the assessment imposed by section 7 of this Act at 2 the time of sale. 3 Each producer shall keep documents regarding its ethanol production and sales for 4 a period of three years. The producer shall make these records available to the 5 council for examination upon request. 6 3. No later than thirty days after the conclusion of each calendar quarter, each 7 producer shall file with the council a report stating the quantity of ethanol produced 8 and the quantity sold during the preceding quarter. 9 **SECTION 9.** Submission of assessments - Civil penalty. 10 <u>1.</u> Each producer shall forward to the council all assessments imposed by section 7 of 11 the Act within thirty days after the conclusion of each calendar quarter. 12 <u>2.</u> If a producer fails to submit the assessments as required by this section, the 13 council may impose a penalty equal to ten percent of the amount due, plus interest 14 at the rate of twelve percent per annum from the due date. 15 **SECTION 10.** Refund of assessment. 16 To receive a refund of any assessment paid in accordance with this chapter, a 1. 17 producer shall submit to the council a written request for a refund application within 18 sixty days after the conclusion of each calendar quarter. 19 The producer shall complete the refund application and return the application to the 2. 20 council, together with a record of the assessment collected, within ninety days after the conclusion of each calendar quarter. The council shall then refund the net 21 22 amount of the assessment that had been collected. 23 If a request for a refund is not submitted to the council within the prescribed time 24 period, the producer is presumed to have agreed to the assessment. 25 **SECTION 11.** Expenditure of funds. The council shall approve all expenditures made
 - received under this Act to the state treasurer for deposit in the ethanol fund. All moneys in the ethanol fund are appropriated on a continuing basis to the council to carry out this Act.

SECTION 12. Continuing appropriation. The council shall forward all moneys

pursuant to this Act. The expenditures must be recorded as directed by the office of
