4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 54-60 of the North Dakota Century Code is 6 created and enacted as follows:

Sustainably grown in North Dakota - Application - Logo - Promotion of commodities.

- 1. The department of commerce shall implement a program to promote agricultural commodities that are sustainably grown in North Dakota.
- 2. A producer may apply to the department and upon demonstrating that the producer's growing practices with respect to a particular commodity meet the department's established criteria for sustainability, the department shall authorize the producer to label and market the commodity as being sustainably grown in North Dakota.
 - 3. The department shall develop and make available for the use of authorized producers a logo indicating that the commodity is sustainably grown in North Dakota. The department shall actively support and promote the sale and use of products identified as sustainably grown in North Dakota.
- 4. The department may establish and charge producers a fee for participating in the program. The department shall forward all fees collected under this section to the state treasurer for deposit in the general fund.
- 5. For purposes of this section, "sustainably grown" means that a crop is grown using
 research-based practices that result in:

4	<u>d.</u>	Decreased use of water;

6	<u>f.</u>	Increased yields; and
7	<u>g.</u>	Greater economic benefit to producers.
