- 1 A concurrent resolution urging the United States Fish and Wildlife Service not to list the
- 2 black-tailed prairie dog, cynomys ludovicianus, as a threatened or endangered species under
- 3 the Endangered Species Act.
- 4 **WHEREAS**, in 2007 the Forest Guardians (also known as WildEarth Guardians),
- 5 Biodiversity Conservation Alliance, Center for Native Ecosystems, and Rocky Mountain Animal
- 6 Defense filed a petition with the United States Fish and Wildlife Service requesting that the
- 7 black-tailed prairie dog, cynomys ludovicianus, be listed as a threatened or endangered
- 8 species under the Endangered Species Act; and
- 9 WHEREAS, the petition filed with the United States Fish and Wildlife Service requested
- 10 that the black-tailed prairie dog, cynomys ludovicianus, be listed as endangered throughout its
- 11 range, which includes Arizona, Colorado, Kansas, Montana, Nebraska, New Mexico, North
- 12 Dakota, Oklahoma, South Dakota, Texas, and Wyoming; and
- 13 WHEREAS, the United States Fish and Wildlife Service has initiated a status review of
- 14 the species to determine if the listing is warranted; and
- WHEREAS, the North Dakota Game and Fish Department has submitted its prairie dog
- 16 management plan to the United States Fish and Wildlife Service and restated the department's
- 17 belief that this state's black-tailed prairie dog, cynomys ludovicianus, population is biologically
- 18 viable; and
- 19 **WHEREAS**, large concentrations of prairie dog populations cause widespread crop
- 20 destruction, compete with livestock for the same grazing areas, and create hazardous
- 21 conditions for livestock;
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES
- 23 OF NORTH DAKOTA, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:
