ENGROSSED HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 3067

1 A concurrent resolution urging the restoration, through legal or political means, of the

2 Environmental Protection Agency's final rule exempting pesticides from the Clean Water Act's

3 permitting requirements.

4 WHEREAS, on November 27, 2007, the Environmental Protection Agency issued a

5 final rule providing that pesticides applied in accordance with the Federal Insecticide,

6 Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act are exempt from the Clean Water Act's permitting

7 requirements; and

8 WHEREAS, in National Cotton Council of America v. United States Environmental

9 Protection Agency, the United States Court of Appeals for the Sixth Circuit vacated the

10 agency's rule on the basis that pesticide residues and biological pesticides constitute pollutants

11 under federal law and must be regulated under the Clean Water Act in order to minimize the

12 impact to human health and the environment; and

WHEREAS, with this decision, farmers, ranchers, utility owners, golf course owners,
and state, local, and federal public entities, among others, will be required to obtain national
pollutant discharge elimination system permits; and

WHEREAS, this decision inevitably will result in complications and delays that will
seriously impact the effective and time-sensitive use of pesticides to combat disease and
crop-destroying insects, and seriously impact the ability of farmers and ranchers to engage in
food production;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF NORTH DAKOTA, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:

That the Sixty-first Legislative Assembly supports the restoration, through legal or political means, of the Environmental Protection Agency's final rule exempting pesticides from the Clean Water Act's permitting requirements, provided that the pesticides are applied in accordance with the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act; and
