1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 57-51.1-07 of the North Dakota Century Code,

2 relating to the transfer of oil extraction tax revenues.

## 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

4 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 57-51.1-07 of the North Dakota Century Code is 5 amended and reenacted as follows:

57-51.1-07. Allocation of moneys in oil extraction tax development fund. Moneys
deposited in the oil extraction tax development fund must be apportioned quarterly transferred
monthly by the state treasurer as follows:

9 Twenty percent must be allocated and credited to the sinking fund established for 1. 10 payment of the state of North Dakota water development bonds, southwest 11 pipeline series, and any moneys in excess of the sum necessary to maintain the 12 accounts within the sinking fund and for the payment of principal and interest on 13 the bonds must be credited to a special trust fund, to be known as the resources 14 trust fund. The resources trust fund must be established in the state treasury and 15 the funds therein must be deposited and invested as are other state funds to earn 16 the maximum amount permitted by law which income must be deposited in the 17 resources trust fund. The principal and income of the resources trust fund may be expended only pursuant to legislative appropriation and are available to: 18

- 19a.The state water commission for planning for and construction of water-related20projects, including rural water systems. These water-related projects must be21those which the state water commission has the authority to undertake and22construct pursuant to chapter 61-02; and
- b. The industrial commission for the funding of programs for development of
  energy conservation and renewable energy sources; for studies for

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1		development of cogeneration systems that increase the capacity of a system
2		to produce more than one kind of energy from the same fuel; for studies for
3		development of waste products utilization; and for the making of grants and
4		loans in connection therewith.
5	2.	Twenty percent must be allocated as provided in section 24 of article X of the
6		Constitution of North Dakota.
7	3.	Sixty percent must be allocated and credited to the state's general fund for general
8		state purposes.
