A BILL for an Act to establish the P-20 education council. 1

2 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 3 SECTION 1. P-20 education council - Members and terms - Compensation. The 4 P-20 education council is established consisting of the following members: 5 The governor or governor's designee, who is the chairman; 1. 6 <u>2.</u> The superintendent of public instruction; 7 <u>3.</u> The commissioner of higher education; 8 The director of the department of career and technical education; 4. 9 5. Two members of the state board of higher education selected by the board to 10 serve a term of at least one year but not longer than their terms of office on the 11 board: 12 Two members of the state board of public school education selected by the board 6. 13 to serve a term of at least one year but not longer than their terms of office on the 14 board; 15 Two members of the education standards and practices board selected by the 7. 16
 - board to serve a term of at least one year but not longer than their terms of office on the board:
 - Two members of the state board for career and technical education selected by the 8. board to serve a term of at least one year but not longer than their terms of office on the board;
 - Two members of the senate, including one member from each faction selected by 9. the chairman of the legislative council, one of whom shall serve an initial two-year term following which the term is four years and one of whom shall be appointed to a four-year term:

1 10. Two members of the house of representatives, including one member from each 2 faction selected by the chairman of the legislative council, one of whom shall serve 3 an initial two-year term following which the term is four years and one of whom 4 shall be appointed to a four-year term; 5 11. The executive director of the North Dakota school boards association; 6 12. The executive director of the North Dakota council of educational leaders; 7 13. The president of the North Dakota education association; 8 14. The president of the North Dakota university system council of college faculties; 9 15. The president and vice president of the North Dakota student association; 10 <u>16.</u> Three members appointed by the governor who are elementary or secondary 11 schoolteachers or administrators, one of whom shall serve an initial two-year term 12 following which the term is four years and two of whom shall be appointed to 13 four-year terms; 14 17. One member appointed by the governor who has special knowledge and expertise 15 relating to special education, who shall serve a four-year term; 16 18. One member appointed by the governor who has special knowledge and expertise 17 in preschool or early childhood education, who shall serve an initial two-year term 18 following which the term is four years; 19 19. Two members appointed by the commissioner of higher education who are higher 20 education institution faculty members, one of whom shall serve an initial two-year 21 term following which the term is four years and one of whom shall be appointed to 22 a four-year term; 23 20. Three members appointed by the commissioner of higher education who are 24 higher education institution administrators, two of whom shall serve initial two-year 25 terms following which the terms are four years and one of whom shall be appointed 26 to a four-year term; 27 <u>21.</u> Two members appointed by the governor representing parents who must at the 28 time of appointment have a child attending a school or higher education institution 29 in the state, one of whom shall serve an initial two-year term following which the 30 term is four years and one of whom shall be appointed to a four-year term;

- 1 22. Two members appointed by the governor representing state tribal schools or with
 2 special knowledge and expertise regarding Indian education issues, one of whom
 3 shall serve an initial two-year term following which the term is four years and one of
 4 whom shall be appointed to a four-year term; and
 5 23. Eight members appointed by the governor representing business and community
 - 23. Eight members appointed by the governor representing business and community leaders, four of whom shall serve initial two-year terms following which the term is four years and four of whom shall be appointed to four-year terms.

The governor or governor's designee may appoint a member as cochairman to serve as chairman if the governor or governor's designee is absent or unable to preside at a meeting or perform other functions.

Members who are officers or employees of the state or members of a state board are entitled to reimbursement of expenses by their respective state agencies or institutions or boards for attending meetings and performing other functions of office. Members of the legislative assembly are entitled to reimbursement of expenses in the same manner and amounts as provided for legislative council committee meetings. Other members are entitled to reimbursement of expenses in the same manner and amounts as state officials for attending meetings and performing other functions of office. Members are not entitled to additional compensation, although members who are officers or employees of the state or a political subdivision must be released from their regular duties for time required to attend council meetings and perform other functions of office without loss of pay and benefits.

SECTION 2. P-20 education council - Meetings - Staff - Funding. The P-20 education council shall meet at least twice annually and at times and locations designated by the chairman. The legislative council shall provide necessary staff support and reimbursement of expenses and other necessary funds to support the council.

SECTION 3. P-20 education council - Duties. The P-20 education council shall:

1. Not later than September 30, 2010, submit to the governor and legislative council a report that includes steps designed to make the North Dakota education system, from preschool through graduate and postgraduate education, a national leader with standards and expectations equivalent to the best-performing countries in the world. Among other items, the report must address and make recommendations regarding:

1 Common performance standards and assessments for high school graduation a. 2 and preparation for work and college; 3 Alignment of P-12 standards and postsecondary curriculum; b. 4 More rigorous curriculum and increased expectations; <u>C.</u> 5 <u>d.</u> Career planning; and 6 Use of a state longitudinal data system for education improvement. e. 7 Beginning in 2012 and not later than September thirtieth of each even-numbered <u>2.</u> 8 year, submit to the governor and legislative council a report that includes an 9 evaluation of the state's education system and progress in implementing prior 10 recommendations and revised or additional recommendations designed to make 11 the North Dakota education system a national leader with standards and 12 expectations equivalent to the best-performing countries in the world or, once that 13 status is attained, to retain that status.
